64B8-13.005 Continuing Education for Biennial Renewal.

(1) Every physician licensed pursuant to Chapter 458, F.S., shall be required to complete 40 hours of continuing medical education courses approved by the Board in the 24 months preceding each biennial renewal period as established by the Department.

(a) – (b) No change.

(c) Completion of two hours of continuing medical education relating to prevention of medical errors which includes a study of root cause analysis, error reduction and prevention, and patient safety, and which is approved by any state or federal government agency, or nationally affiliated professional association, or any provider of Category I or II American Medical Association Continuing Medical Education. One hour of a two hour course which is provided by a facility licensed pursuant to Chapter 395, F.S., for its employees may be used to partially meet this requirement. The course must include information relating to the five most mis-diagnosed conditions during the previous biennium, as determined by the Board. While wrong site/wrong procedure surgery continues to be the most common basis for quality of care violations, the following areas have been determined as the five most mis-diagnosed conditions: cancer related conditions; surgery complications; respiratory related conditions; OB/GYN related conditions; cardiology related conditions issues; neurological/spine related issues; cardiac/stroke related issues; infectious/communicable diseases; pulmonary related issues.

64B29-2.001 Disciplinary Guidelines.

(1) Purpose. The department shall impose disciplinary penalties upon a determination that the holder of a registration certificate has violated any provision of chapter 484 or 456, F.S., or any rules promulgated by the department or the Board of Opticianry.

(2) Violations and Range of Penalties. In imposing discipline, the department shall act in accordance with the disciplinary guidelines set forth in form DH5028-MQA, Optical Establishment Disciplinary Guidelines (11/2017), incorporated by reference and available at <https://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-#####>. The final order shall explain any mitigating or aggravating circumstances used to justify any deviation from the specified guidelines. In addition to the penalty imposed, the department shall recover the costs of the investigation and prosecution of a case. If the violation is for fraud or making a false or fraudulent representation, the department shall impose a fine of \$10,000 per count or offense in addition to any other penalty imposed.
