PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The rule is being amended to make the text within the incorporated polling place procedures manual more plain, clear and unambiguous, ensure uniformity in the procedures in the polling place, and address common problems encountered by voters and poll workers at the polls as reported or observed by election staff and provide or clarify procedures to mitigate or eliminate those problems. The proposed amendments expand more upon security at the polls and ballot marking devices.

SUMMARY: This rule incorporates by reference a uniform polling place procedures manual

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

The Agency has determined that the proposed rule is not expected to require legislative ratification based on the statement of estimated regulatory costs or if no SERC is required, the information expressly relied upon and described herein: This rule will not require legislative ratification pursuant to Section 120.541(3), F.S., because the rule applies only to election-related activities. Based upon past experiences with rules of this nature, this rule will not have an adverse effect on businesses or private-sector economic growth, job-creation, employment or investment; it is not likely to have an adverse impact on business competitiveness nor innovation in excess of the statutory threshold; nor will it increase regulatory costs in excess of the threshold mandating legislative ratification. No other statute requires legislative ratification for this rule.

SUMMARY: The Department of the Lottery will conduct the \$400,000 Super GROUPER® Second Chance Promotion beginning June 11, 2018, and continuing through August 6, 2018, in which players who purchase a GROUPER play can enter the free LUCKY MONEY™ ticket that is issued as a part of the GROUPER play into a drawing for a chance to win a cash prize.

53ER18-27 \$400,000 Super GROUPER® Second Chance Promotion

(1) Beginning June 11, 2018, through August 6, 2018, (Promotional Period) the Florida Lottery will conduct the \$400,000 Super GROUPER® Second Chance Promotion ("Promotion") in which players who purchase a GROUPER play can enter the free LUCKY MONEY™ ticket that is issued as a part of the GROUPER play into a drawing for a chance to win a cash prize.

(2) How to Enter.

To enter a qualifying LUCKY MONEY ticket into one of the drawings, players must enter on the Florida Lottery’s website at flalottery.com. A qualifying LUCKY MONEY ticket is a LUCKY MONEY ticket that is issued as a free ticket as part of a GROUPER play purchased during the Promotional Period. Both winning and non-winning qualifying LUCKY MONEY tickets may be used to enter the Promotion. Players may enter their qualifying LUCKY MONEY ticket into a drawing beginning on the day after the GROUPER play is purchased. On the home page of the Florida Lottery’s website, players can click on the \$400,000 Super GROUPER® Second Chance Promotion banner and follow the directions. Players will be prompted to log-in or register. The 19-digit ticket number is located near the bottom of the free LUCKY MONEY ticket. Each valid ticket number may only be entered one time and only into one drawing. Tickets should not be mailed to the Florida Lottery for entry into the Promotion. Tickets received in the mail by the Florida Lottery will not be entered in a drawing and will not be returned. The odds of winning depend on the number of entries entered. All entries are subject to validation by the Florida Lottery and may be disqualified if eligibility requirements are not met.

(3) Drawings. A total of four drawings will be held. Prizewinners for each drawing will be randomly selected from entries submitted and received before midnight ET on the last day of the entry period for that drawing. The entry periods and drawing dates are set forth in the table below.

In each of the drawings, a total of 40 valid entries will be drawn by the Florida Lottery using a certified random number generation process. The first through fourth valid entries drawn will each win a top prize of \$20,000. The fifth through twenty-fourth valid entries drawn will each win a second prize of \$1,000. The twenty-fifth through fortieth valid entries drawn will be used in the order in which they were drawn and in the order of need to select an alternate top or second prize winner in the event a top or second prize cannot be awarded. Drawings shall be public, held in Tallahassee, Florida, and witnessed by an accountant employed by an independent certified public accounting firm.

(4) Prizes. The following table sets forth the prizes available in the Promotion.

(5) Notification.

(a) The prizewinners in each drawing will be posted on flalottery.com after the drawing.

(b) The Florida Lottery will attempt to notify each prizewinner by telephone or email using the contact information provided in the prizewinner’s registration data no later than one business day after the prizewinners are posted on the Florida Lottery’s website. The Florida Lottery deems the prizewinner’s registration data as the prizewinner’s official contact information, including the physical mailing address. The Florida Lottery will not attempt to further locate a prizewinner if attempts to reach the prizewinner by telephone or email are unsuccessful. If the Florida Lottery is unable to have contact by telephone or email with a prizewinner within two weeks of the date the prizewinners are posted on the website, the prizewinner will forfeit his or her right to claim the prize and the Florida Lottery will award the prize to an alternate prizewinner in accordance with subsection (3) above. If the Florida Lottery is unable to have contact by email or telephone with the alternate prizewinner within two weeks of the date of notification, the alternate prizewinner will forfeit his or her right to claim the prize and the Florida Lottery will award the prize to the next alternate prizewinner. This process will continue until an alternate is contacted or the Florida Lottery has exhausted the list of alternates due to unsuccessful notification attempts or due to failure by a prizewinner or an alternate prizewinner to timely provide required claim documentation as set forth in subsection (6) below. If the Florida Lottery exhausts the list of alternate prizewinners, the prize will not be awarded.

(6) How to Claim a Prize. To claim any prize in a Promotion drawing, the prizewinner must submit to the Florida Lottery a completed Winner Claim Form DOL 173-2, revised 9/13, or Spanish Winner Claim Form DOL 173-2S, revised 9/13 and a copy of acceptable identification as set forth in the rule of the Florida Lottery governing payment of prizes. A copy of the current prize payment rule can be obtained from the Florida Lottery, Office of the General Counsel, 250 Marriott Drive, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-4011. Forms DOL 173-2 and DOL 173-2S are hereby incorporated by reference and may be obtained at any Florida Lottery office, from the Florida

Lottery's website at flalottery.com, or by writing to: Florida Lottery, Customer Service, 250 Marriott Drive, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-4016. The required documentation must be received by the Florida Lottery no later than two weeks after the Florida Lottery has first made personal contact with the prizewinner. If the Florida Lottery has not received the required documentation from a prizewinner by the fourteenth day after notification, the prizewinner will forfeit his or her right to claim the prize and the Florida Lottery will award the prize to an alternate prizewinner in accordance with subsections (3) and (5) above. The same timeframe for a prizewinner to return required documentation to the Florida Lottery shall apply to an alternate prizewinner. A prizewinner in this Promotion is not required to submit to the Florida Lottery the free LUCKY MONEY ticket that he or she used to generate an entry into the drawing in order to claim a prize.

(7) Award of Top Prizes. Upon the Florida Lottery's timely receipt of a top prize winner's required documentation, the Lottery will award a prize of \$20,000, less applicable federal income tax withholding.

(8) Award of Second Prizes. Upon the Florida Lottery's timely receipt of a second prize winner's required documentation, the Lottery will award a prize of \$1,000.

(9) Taxes. Except as specifically described herein, all federal, state and/or local taxes or other fees on the prizes won in the \$400,000 Super GROUPER® Second Chance Promotion will be the responsibility of the prizewinner. Thirty percent federal income tax will be withheld from any prize won by a nonresident alien prizewinner in the Promotion, regardless of the amount of the prize. The reporting and subsequent payment of any additional federal, state and/or local taxes shall be the responsibility of the nonresident alien prizewinner.

(10) Other Restrictions and Provisions.

(a) All prizes are subject to the provisions of Chapter 24, Florida Statutes, and rules promulgated thereunder. Prizes shall be paid in accordance with the rule of the Florida Lottery governing payment of prizes. A copy of the current prize payment rule can be obtained from the Florida Lottery, Office of the General Counsel, 250 Marriott Drive, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-4011.

(b) All prizewinners will be analyzed for state-owed debt. If a prizewinner is identified as owing an outstanding debt to any state agency or owes child support collected through a court, the debt will be offset in accordance with section 24.115(4), Florida Statutes. If the debt is an amount less than the amount of the prize, the balance of the prize after deduction of the debt shall be awarded. If the debt is an amount greater than the amount of the prize, the entire prize amount will be applied to the outstanding debt.

(c) Players must be at least 18 years of age. Persons prohibited by section 24.116, Florida Statutes, from purchasing

a Florida Lottery ticket are not eligible to enter the \$400,000 Super GROUPER® Second Chance Promotion.

(d) By entering the \$400,000 Super GROUPER® Second Chance Promotion, a player gives his or her permission for the Florida Lottery to photograph and/or videotape and record the prizewinner with or without prior notification and to use the name, photograph, videotape, and/or recording of the prizewinner for advertising or publicity purposes without additional compensation.

53ER18-28 GROUPER® Retailer Bonus Commission Promotion

SUMMARY: This emergency rule sets forth the GROUPER® Retailer Bonus Sales Commission Promotion that will begin June 11, 2018 and continue through August 6, 2018.

THE FULL TEXT OF THE EMERGENCY RULE IS:

53ER18-28 GROUPER® Retailer Bonus Sales Commission Promotion.

(1) Beginning June 11, 2018, and continuing through August 6, 2018, (Promotional Period) the Florida Lottery will conduct the GROUPER® Retailer Bonus Sales Commission Promotion. The Florida Lottery will pay Florida Lottery retailers a five percent bonus sales commission in addition to the standard five percent sales commission set forth in Rule 53ER13-46 F.A.C., *Retailer Compensation*, for a total ten percent sales commission on the value of each GROUPER play sold during the Promotional Period. A GROUPER play is valued at \$6.00. Therefore, a retailer will earn a \$.30 standard sales commission plus a \$.30 bonus sales commission for a \$.60 total sales commission per GROUPER play sold.

(2) A GROUPER play is comprised of a \$1.00 PICK 4™ Straight/Box ticket, a \$1.00 FANTASY 5® ticket, a \$1.00 FLORIDA LOTTO® ticket, a \$2.00 CASH4LIFE® ticket and a FREE \$1.00 LUCKY MONEY™ ticket. If the Quick Pick numbers selected for the PICK 4 game have been cut off for the day due to the game's liability limit being reached so that the PICK 4 ticket in the GROUPER play does not print, the

purchase price of the transaction will be automatically adjusted, and the retailer will receive the otherwise applicable standard sales commission and bonus sales commission on only the remaining tickets in the GROUPER play, including the FREE \$1.00 LUCKY MONEY™ ticket.

(3) The standard sales commissions will be reflected on the retailer's weekly Settlement Report.

(4) The bonus sales commissions will be reflected on the retailer's weekly Settlement Report as an adjustment credit as follows: (1) following the end of the 2017-2018 fiscal year for bonus sales commissions earned June 11 through June 30, 2018, and (2) following the conclusion of the Promotional Period for bonus sales commissions earned July 1 through August 6, 2018.

(5) Retailers whose Florida Lottery contracts are terminated or inactivated prior to payment of the GROUPER bonus sales commissions shall be paid the bonus sales commissions earned provided said termination or inactivation was not due to noncompliance with Chapter 24, Florida Statutes, Chapter 53, Florida Administrative Code, or terms of the retailer contract.

(6) GROUPER bonus sales commissions will be considered compensation to a retailer and will be reported to the Internal Revenue Service by the Florida Lottery. The Florida Lottery reserves the right to apply bonus sales commissions earned against a retailer's outstanding debt to the Florida Lottery, and to award the remaining balance of the bonus sales commissions, if any.

61C-4.010 Sanitation and Safety Requirements

The Florida Department of Business and Professional Regulation, Division of Hotels and Restaurants hereby gives notice:

On May 21, 2018, the Division of Hotels and Restaurants received a Petition for a Routine Variance for Paragraph 4-301.12(A), 2009 FDA Food Code and subsection 61C-4.010(5), Florida Administrative Code, from First Class Concessions Inc. located in Clearwater. The above referenced F.A.C. addresses the requirement that dishwashing facilities for manually washing, rinsing and sanitizing equipment and utensils are provided. They are requesting to share the dishwashing areas with another food service establishment under the same ownership and on the same premise.

The Petition for this variance was published in Vol. 44/100 on May 22, 2018. The Order for this Petition was signed and approved on June 6, 2018. After a complete review of the variance request, the Division finds that the application of this Rule will create a financial hardship to the food service establishment. This Order is final and effective on the date filed with the clerk of the Department unless a petition is filed in accordance with the paragraphs below or unless a request for extension of time in which to file a petition is filed within the required timeframe and conforms to Rule 62-110.106(4), F.A.C. Upon timely filing of a petition or a request for an extension, this Order will not be effective until further Order of the Department.

A person whose substantial interests are affected by this Order may petition for an administrative proceeding (hearing) in accordance with sections 120.569 and 120.57 of the Florida Statutes. The petition must contain the information set forth below and must be filed (received) with the Agency Clerk for the Department of Environmental Protection, at Office of General Counsel, Mail Station 35, 3900 Commonwealth Boulevard, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-3000, or by electronic mail at [Agency\\_Clerk@dep.state.fl.us](mailto:Agency_Clerk@dep.state.fl.us), within 21 days of

receipt of this Notice. Failure to file a petition within this time period shall constitute a waiver of any right such person may have to request an administrative determination (hearing) under sections 120.569 and 120.57 of the Florida Statutes. Any subsequent intervention will only be at the approval of the presiding officer upon motion filed pursuant to Rule 28-106.205, F.A.C.

A petition must contain the following information:

- (a) The name and address of each agency affected and each agency's file or identification number, if known;
- (b) The name, address, and telephone number of the petitioner; the name, address, and telephone number of the petitioner's representative, if any, which shall be the address for service purposes during the course of the proceeding; and an explanation of how the petitioner's substantial interests will be affected by the agency determination;
- (c) A statement of how and when the petitioner received notice of the agency decision;
- (d) A statement of all disputed issues of material fact. If there are none, the petition must so indicate;
- (e) A concise statement of the ultimate facts alleged, including the specific facts which petitioner contends warrant reversal or modification of the Department's action;
- (f) A statement of the specific rules or statutes the petitioner contends requires reversal or modification of the Department's action, including an explanation of how the alleged facts relate to the specific rules or statutes; and
- (g) A statement of the relief sought by petitioner, stating precisely the action that the petitioner wants the Department to take.

A petition that does not dispute the materials facts on which the Department's action is based shall state that no such facts are in dispute and otherwise contain the same information as set forth above, as required by Rule 28-106.301, F.A.C.

Because the administrative hearing process is designed to formulate final agency action, the filing of a petition means that, the Department's final action may be different from the position taken by it in this Notice. Persons whose substantial interests will be affected by any such final decision of the Department on the petition have the right to petition to become a party to the proceeding, in accordance with the requirements set forth above.

When the Order is final, any party to the Order has the right to seek judicial review of the Order pursuant to section 120.68 of the Florida Statutes, by filing a Notice of Appeal pursuant to Rule 9.110 of the Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure, with the Clerk of the Department in the Office of General Counsel, Mail Station 35, 3900 Commonwealth Boulevard, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-3000; and by filing a copy of the notice of appeal

accompanied by the applicable filing fees with the appropriate district court of appeal. The notice of appeal must be filed within 30 days from the date when the final order is filed with the Clerk of the Department.
