Pursuant to Section 403.067(6), F.S., TMDLs must be adopted in rule by the Secretary of the Department. Chapter 62-304, F.A.C., was established as the rule chapter within which rules adopting TMDLs shall reside.

53ER18-53 HOT DICE

SUMMARY: This emergency rule describes the Fast Play™ game, HOT DICE for which the Department of the Lottery will start selling tickets on October 1, 2018. The rule sets forth the specifics of the game; determination of prizewinners; estimated odds of winning, value and number of prizes in the game.

THE FULL TEXT OF THE EMERGENCY RULE IS:

53ER18-53 HOT DICE.

(1) Name of Game. "HOT DICE."

(2) Price. HOT DICE lottery tickets sell for \$1.00 per play.

(3) Game Description. HOT DICE is a Fast Play™ instant-win game (also known as an online terminal game) printed from an authorized Florida Lottery retailer terminal at the time of purchase. Players may play the game and determine immediately if the ticket is a winner. All prizes are predetermined. The player does not have the ability to select his or her own numbers or play symbols.

(4) HOT DICE Lottery Ticket Purchase. Players may purchase a HOT DICE lottery ticket at an authorized retailer by: telling the retailer or presenting to the retailer a Fast Play barcode found on HOT DICE supporting materials; or by submitting a HOT DICE play slip for processing through a retailer terminal. Supporting materials with a HOT DICE Fast Play barcode include tear pads, game brochures or Florida Lottery emails. A HOT DICE Fast Play barcode may also be printed from the Florida Lottery's website at flalottery.com.

(a) Players who choose to purchase a HOT DICE lottery ticket or tickets by telling the retailer shall specify the number of plays desired. Each play will print on a separate ticket.

(b) Players who choose to present a barcode to purchase a HOT DICE lottery ticket shall provide the barcoded material to the retailer to scan. One scanned barcode will produce one HOT DICE lottery ticket.

(c) Players who choose to use a play slip to purchase a HOT DICE lottery ticket or tickets may mark the appropriate box on the play slip for the number of plays desired and submit it to the retailer. The retailer will process the play slip through the retailer terminal. Each play will print on a separate ticket. Play slips must be Florida Lottery approved and players must use only blue or black ink or pencil for making selections. The use of mechanical, electronic, computer-generated or any other non-manual method of marking play slips is prohibited.

(d) HOT DICE lottery tickets cannot be purchased through a Florida Lottery vending machine.

(e) HOT DICE lottery tickets cannot be canceled.

(5) How to Play and Determination of Prizewinners. Each HOT DICE lottery ticket will contain a "YOUR ROLLS" play area that contains nine separate "YOUR ROLLS" and a "HOT ROLL" play area that contains one "HOT ROLL." Each roll is played separately. Each of "YOUR ROLLS" and the "HOT ROLL" is comprised of two dice. Each die contains dots representing the numbers 1 to 6. To play, add the dice in each ROLL. A ticket having two dice in a single "ROLL," the total of which is greater than the total of the two dice in the "HOT ROLL," shall entitle the claimant to the corresponding prize shown for that ROLL. A player can win up to three times on a ticket.

(6) The prizes are: \$1, \$2, \$3, \$5, \$10, \$25, \$50, \$100 and \$1,000.

(7) The prize structure and odds of winning are as follows:

The HOT DICE prize structure will be replenished automatically as each ticket is sold in each prize tier, including both winning and non-winning prize tiers. The odds remain the same for each ticket purchase for the life of the game.

(8) HOT DICE Additional Provisions.

(a) By purchasing a HOT DICE lottery ticket, a player agrees to comply with and abide by all rules and regulations of the Florida Lottery.

(b) Prizes must be claimed within 60 days after the official end of game. All HOT DICE prizes shall be paid in a single, lump-sum payment. Ticket validation requirements for Fast Play HOT DICE lottery tickets are set forth in the rule of the Florida Lottery governing payment of prizes. Payment of prizes for Fast Play HOT DICE lottery tickets shall be made in accordance with the rule of the Florida Lottery governing payment of prizes. (c) It is the responsibility of the player to verify the readability of the information printed on the HOT DICE lottery ticket at the time of purchase. Additionally, the player should check the date and time printed on a HOT DICE lottery ticket to confirm that the printed date and time of purchase correspond to the actual date and time of purchase. It shall be the responsibility of the player to immediately notify the retailer of any such errors or discrepancies of a ticket prior to leaving the retailer location.

(d) Subject to a retailer’s hours of operation and online gaming system availability, HOT DICE lottery tickets are available for purchase daily between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 12:00 midnight, Eastern Time (ET).

53ER18-54 IN BETWEEN.

(1) Name of Game. “IN BETWEEN.”

(2) Price. IN BETWEEN lottery tickets sell for \$2.00 per play.

(3) Game Description. IN BETWEEN is a Fast Play™ instant-win game (also known as an online terminal game) printed from an authorized Florida Lottery retailer terminal at the time of purchase. Players may play the game and determine immediately if the ticket is a winner. All prizes are predetermined. The player does not have the ability to select his or her own numbers or play symbols.

(4) IN BETWEEN Lottery Ticket Purchase. Players may purchase an IN BETWEEN lottery ticket at an authorized retailer by: telling the retailer or presenting to the retailer a Fast Play barcode found on IN BETWEEN supporting materials; or by submitting an IN BETWEEN play slip for processing through a retailer terminal. Supporting materials with an IN BETWEEN Fast Play barcode include tear pads, game brochures or Florida Lottery emails. An IN BETWEEN Fast Play barcode may also be printed from the Florida Lottery’s website at flalottery.com.

(a) Players who choose to purchase an IN BETWEEN lottery ticket or tickets by telling the retailer shall specify the number of plays desired. Each play will print on a separate ticket.

(b) Players who choose to present a barcode to purchase an IN BETWEEN lottery ticket shall provide the barcoded material to the retailer to scan. One scanned barcode will produce one IN BETWEEN lottery ticket.

(c) Players who choose to use a play slip to purchase an IN BETWEEN lottery ticket or tickets may mark the appropriate box on the play slip for the number of plays desired and submit it to the retailer. The retailer will process the play slip through the retailer terminal. Each play will print on a separate ticket. Play slips must be Florida Lottery approved and players must use only blue or black ink or pencil for making selections. The use of mechanical, electronic, computer-generated or any other non-manual method of marking play slips is prohibited.

(d) IN BETWEEN lottery tickets cannot be purchased through a Florida Lottery vending machine.

(e) IN BETWEEN lottery tickets cannot be canceled.

(5) How to Play and Determination of Prizewinners. Each IN BETWEEN lottery ticket will contain a “YOUR NUMBERS” play area that contains twelve numbers from a field of one to forty and an “IN BETWEEN” play area that contains two numbers from a field of one to forty. To play, count the number of “YOUR NUMBERS” that fall within the two “IN BETWEEN” numbers (not including the two “IN BETWEEN” numbers themselves). For example, if 20 and 25 are the two IN BETWEEN numbers, the numbers 21, 22 23, and 24 are the only numbers that fall within the two IN BETWEEN numbers. A ticket having four to twelve numbers in the “YOUR NUMBERS” play area that fall within the two “IN BETWEEN” numbers (not including the two “IN BETWEEN” numbers themselves) shall entitle the claimant to the corresponding prize shown in the PRIZE LEGEND for the total number of numbers IN BETWEEN. Only the highest prize won will be paid per ticket.

The BREAK THE BANK prize structure will be replenished automatically as each ticket is sold in each prize tier, including both winning and non-winning prize tiers. The odds remain the same for each ticket purchase for the life of the game.

(8) BREAK THE BANK Additional Provisions.

(a) By purchasing a BREAK THE BANK lottery ticket, a player agrees to comply with and abide by all rules and regulations of the Florida Lottery.

(b) Prizes must be claimed within 60 days after the official end of game. All BREAK THE BANK prizes shall be paid in a single, lump-sum payment. Ticket validation requirements for Fast Play BREAK THE BANK lottery tickets are set forth in the rule of the Florida Lottery governing payment of prizes.

Payment of prizes for Fast Play BREAK THE BANK lottery tickets shall be made in accordance with the rule of the Florida Lottery governing payment of prizes. A copy of the current rule can be obtained from the Florida Lottery, Office of the General Counsel, 250 Marriott Drive, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-4011.

(c) It is the responsibility of the player to verify the readability of the information printed on the BREAK THE BANK lottery ticket at the time of purchase. Additionally, the player should check the date and time printed on a BREAK THE BANK lottery ticket to confirm that the printed date and time of purchase correspond to the actual date and time of purchase. It shall be the responsibility of the player to immediately notify the retailer of any such errors or discrepancies of a ticket prior to leaving the retailer location.

(d) Subject to a retailer’s hours of operation and online gaming system availability, BREAK THE BANK lottery tickets are available for purchase daily between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 12:00 midnight, Eastern Time (ET).

(9) The effective date of this emergency rule is October 1, 2018.

SUMMARY: The rule sets forth the provisions for the Fast Play™ Retailer Double Sales Commission Promotion which begins October 1, 2018.

THE FULL TEXT OF THE EMERGENCY RULE IS:

53ER18-56 Fast Play™ Retailer Double Sales Commission Promotion.

(1) Beginning October 1, 2018, the Florida Lottery will conduct the Fast Play™ Retailer Double Sales Commission Promotion (“Promotion”). The Promotion will continue through October 31, 2018, or end on the date on which the funding allocated to the Promotion has been utilized; whichever date occurs first (“Promotion Period”). Retailers will be notified

of the official end date of the Promotion by retailer terminal messaging.

(2) During the Promotion Period, the Florida Lottery will pay Florida Lottery retailers an additional five percent bonus sales commission in addition to the standard five percent sales commission for a total ten percent sales commission (“Double Sales Commission”) on the purchase price of each HOT DICE, IN BETWEEN and BREAK THE BANK Fast Play™ lottery ticket sold.

(3) The standard sales commission will be reflected on the retailer’s weekly Settlement Report.

(4) The bonus sales commission will be reflected on the retailer’s weekly Settlement Report as an adjustment credit at the conclusion of the Promotion.

(5) Retailers whose Florida Lottery contracts are terminated or inactivated prior to payment of the bonus sales commissions shall be paid the commissions earned provided said termination or inactivation was not due to noncompliance with Chapter 24, Florida Statutes, Chapter 53, Florida Administrative Code, or terms of the retailer contract.

(6) Bonus sales commissions will be considered compensation to a retailer and will be reported to the Internal Revenue Service by the Florida Lottery. The Florida Lottery reserves the right to apply a bonus sales commission earned against a retailer’s outstanding debt to the Florida Lottery, and to award the remaining balance of the bonus sales commissions, if any.

SUMMARY: This emergency rule describes the Fast Play™ Replay Second Chance Promotion in which players who purchase a HOT DICE, IN BETWEEN or BREAK THE BANK Fast Play lottery ticket can earn entries into a drawing for a chance to win a cash prize.

THE FULL TEXT OF THE EMERGENCY RULE IS:

53ER18-57 Fast Play™ Replay Second Chance Promotion.

(1) Beginning October 1, 2018, and continuing through November 14, 2018, (“Promotion Period”) the Florida Lottery will conduct the Fast Play™ Replay Second Chance Promotion (“Promotion”). Players who purchase a HOT DICE, IN BETWEEN or BREAK THE BANK Fast Play lottery ticket can scan the barcode on their tickets using the Florida Lottery Collect ‘N Win app on a smartphone or tablet or can manually enter the ticket number through the Florida Lottery’s website to collect symbols and earn entries into a drawing for a chance to win a cash prize. Both winning and non-winning HOT DICE, IN BETWEEN and BREAK THE BANK Fast Play lottery tickets may be used to enter the Promotion. Only HOT DICE, IN BETWEEN and BREAK THE BANK Fast Play lottery tickets purchased during the Promotion Period may be used to enter the Promotion.

(2) How to Participate.

(a) Florida Lottery Collect ‘N Win App Download and Registration. A player may participate in the Promotion by downloading the free Florida Lottery Collect ‘N Win app at the App Store or at Google Play®. After the app is downloaded and opened, the “Welcome” page will be displayed. Click on the navigation bar found in the top left corner, select the “Login” button and click on “Sign in with email.” “Sign in with Facebook,” or “Sign in with Twitter” to log in. After logging in, a “Register” page will be displayed. Players must register their contact information one time upon first usage to activate their account. A player will be sent an email directing the player to confirm his or her registration. The player should check the junk mail or spam folder if he or she does not promptly receive an email confirmation. Thereafter, the player may directly login by selecting his or her preferred “Sign in” method.

(b) Web Browser. A player may participate in the Promotion via web browser by visiting the Florida Lottery’s homepage, flalottery.com, clicking on the Fast Play™ Replay Second Chance Promotion banner and following the directions, or by going directly to flalottery.com/fastplayreplay and clicking on the Login link at the top right corner of the page to reach the Login page to login/register as described in paragraph (2)(a) above.

(c) Regardless of whether a player chooses to participate in the Promotion by using the Florida Lottery Collect ‘N Win app or web browser, the following provisions shall apply:

1. the player may use the same account login information to enter tickets;

2. the player will only be required to register one time; and

3. the player’s entry history will be cumulative among the entry platforms.

(3) How to Earn Entries.

To collect play symbols and earn entries into a drawing, a player may scan the barcode on the bottom of a HOT DICE, IN

BETWEEN or BREAK THE BANK lottery ticket using a camera on a smartphone or tablet, or a player may manually enter the 19-digit ticket number (located near the bottom of the ticket) on the entry page at flalottery.com/fastplayreplay. Four game cards will appear on the screen. Each game card contains four spots to collect four symbols. A HOT DICE, IN BETWEEN or BREAK THE BANK ticket number entered will randomly generate a quantity (2, 4, 6, 8, or 10) of the four play symbols and place them in an available game card. Once a symbol has been collected on all four play cards, the symbol will be eliminated from the random selection process. When a single game card is filled up with all four different symbols, an entry is generated into the next available drawing and the game card is reset to capture more symbols towards the next entry. Partially completed cards will carry over to the next entry period. A player may earn multiple entries during the promotion period; however, a player may only manually enter or scan up to two hundred tickets per day. Each ticket number can only be scanned or entered one time. Entries that include training tickets that were produced by a retailer terminal while in training mode or tickets with invalid ticket numbers will be disqualified from the applicable drawing or drawings. The odds of winning depend on the number of entries in each drawing. All entries are subject to validation by the Florida Lottery and may be disqualified if eligibility requirements are not met. HOT DICE, IN BETWEEN and BREAK THE BANK lottery tickets should not be mailed to the Lottery for entry into a Promotion drawing. HOT DICE, IN BETWEEN and BREAK THE BANK lottery tickets received in the mail by the Florida Lottery will not be entered into a drawing and will not be returned.

(4) Bonus Game/Coupons.

During the Promotion Period, coupons will be generated for every “nth” ticket scanned or entered statewide up to a maximum of 100 coupons per day. The description and number of each type of coupon generated per day is as follows:

- (a) \$25 Cash Prize (up to 10 per day);
- (b) Buy a \$1 Fast Play (HOT DICE) ticket; get a free FANTASY 5® Quick Pick ticket (up to 30 per day);
- (c) Buy a \$2 Fast Play (IN BETWEEN) ticket; get a free FANTASY 5® Quick Pick ticket (up to 30 per day);
- (d) Buy a \$5 Fast Play (BREAK THE BANK) ticket; get a free FLORIDA LOTTO® Quick Pick ticket (up to 30 per day).

When an nth ticket is generated, it will activate a Spin & Win bonus game in which the player can either choose to play the bonus game by clicking on the “Play” button or choose not to play the bonus game by clicking on the “OK” button. Regardless of whether the player plays the bonus game, a coupon will be added to the “My Coupons” section of the “Coupons” page of the player’s account. To redeem a coupon, the player must print the coupon and present it to any Florida Lottery retailer or a Florida Lottery District Office. Coupons

may not be redeemed by mail. Coupons are valid for one use only and must be redeemed by 11:59:59 ET on January 31, 2019. The odds of winning a coupon depend on the number of tickets entered per day.

(5) Drawings and Number of Prizes. The Florida Lottery will conduct a total of three drawings. Prizewinners for each drawing will be randomly selected from entries submitted and received before midnight ET on the last day of the entry period for that drawing. Entries will be good for one drawing only. Prizewinners will be randomly selected using a certified random number generation process. Drawings shall be public, held in Tallahassee, Florida, and witnessed by an accountant employed by an independent certified public accounting firm. The drawing dates and entry periods are as follows:

(a) In each of the drawings, the Florida Lottery will draw a total of sixty-six entries. The first valid entry drawn will win the top prize of \$10,000. The second through forty-first valid entries drawn will each win a second prize of \$500. The remaining valid entries drawn will be used as alternates in the order in which they were drawn and in the order of need to select a prizewinner in the event a prize cannot be awarded. A total of forty-one prizes will be available in each drawing.

(b) The following table sets forth the number of prizes and the amount of the prizes available in the Promotion:

(6) Prizewinner Notification.

(a) The prizewinners in each drawing will be posted on flalottery.com after the drawing.

(b) The Florida Lottery will attempt to notify each prizewinner by telephone or email using the contact information provided in the prizewinner’s registration data no later than one business day (Monday – Friday) after the prizewinners are posted on the Florida Lottery’s website. The Florida Lottery deems the prizewinner’s registration data as the prizewinner’s official contact information, including the physical mailing address. The Florida Lottery will not attempt to further locate a prizewinner if attempts to reach the prizewinner by telephone or email are unsuccessful. If the

Florida Lottery is unable to have contact by telephone or email with a prizewinner within two weeks of the date the prizewinners are posted on the website, the prizewinner will forfeit his or her right to claim the prize and the Florida Lottery will award the prize to an alternate prizewinner in accordance with paragraph (5)(a) above. If the Florida Lottery is unable to have contact by email or telephone with the alternate prizewinner within two weeks of the date of notification, the alternate prizewinner will forfeit his or her right to claim the prize and the Florida Lottery will award the prize to the next alternate prizewinner. This process will continue until an alternate is contacted or the Florida Lottery has exhausted the list of alternates due to unsuccessful notification attempts or due to failure by a winner or an alternate prizewinner to timely provide required claim documentation as set forth in subsection (7) below. If the Florida Lottery exhausts the list of alternate prizewinners, the prize will not be awarded.

(7) How to Claim a Prize.

(a) Top Prize. To claim the top prize in a Fast Play™ Replay Second Chance Promotion drawing, the prizewinner must submit to the Florida Lottery a completed Winner Claim Form DOL-173-2, Revised 9/13, or Spanish Winner Claim Form DOL-173-2S, Revised 9/13, and a copy of acceptable identification as set forth in the rule of the Florida Lottery governing payment of prizes. A copy of the current prize payment rule can be obtained from the Florida Lottery, Office of the General Counsel, 250 Marriott Drive, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-4011. Forms DOL-173-2 and DOL-173-2S are hereby incorporated by reference and can be obtained from any Florida Lottery office or retailer, from the Florida Lottery's website, flalottery.com, or by writing to: Florida Lottery, Customer Service, 250 Marriott Drive, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-4016.

(b) Second Prize. To claim a second prize in a Fast Play™ Replay Second Chance Promotion drawing, a prizewinner must submit to the Florida Lottery a copy of acceptable identification as set forth in the rule of the Florida Lottery governing payment of prizes.

(c) For both top and second prizes, the required documentation must be received by the Florida Lottery no later than two weeks after the Florida Lottery has first made contact by telephone or email with the prizewinner. If the Florida Lottery has not received the required documentation from a prizewinner by the fourteenth day after notification, the prizewinner will forfeit his or her right to claim the prize and the Florida Lottery will award the prize to an alternate prizewinner as described in paragraphs (5)(a) and (6)(b) above.

The same timeframe for a winner to return required documentation to the Florida Lottery shall apply to an alternate prizewinner. A prizewinner in this Promotion is not required to submit the HOT DICE, IN BETWEEN or BREAK THE BANK lottery ticket(s) he or she scanned or manually entered to generate an entry to claim a prize.

(8) Award of Top Prizes. Upon the Florida Lottery's timely receipt of a top prize winner's required documentation, the Lottery will award a prize of \$10,000, less applicable federal income tax withholding.

(9) Award of Second Prizes. Upon the Florida Lottery's timely receipt of a second prize winner's required documentation, the Lottery will award a prize of \$500.

(10) Taxes. Except as specifically described herein, all federal, state and/or local taxes or other fees on the prizes won in the Fast Play™ Replay Second Chance Promotion will be the responsibility of the prizewinner. Thirty percent federal income tax withholding will be withheld from any prize won by a nonresident alien prizewinner in the Promotion, regardless of the amount of the prize. The reporting and subsequent payment of any additional federal, state and/or local taxes shall be the responsibility of the nonresident alien prizewinner.

(11) Other Restrictions and Provisions.

(a) All prizes are subject to the provisions of Chapter 24, Florida Statutes, and rules promulgated thereunder. Prizes shall be paid in accordance with the rule of the Florida Lottery governing payment of prizes. If the debt is an amount greater than the amount of the prize, the entire prize amount will be applied to the outstanding debt.

(c) Players must be at least 18 years of age. Persons prohibited by section 24.116, Florida Statutes, from purchasing a Florida Lottery ticket are not eligible to enter the Fast Play™ Replay Second Chance Promotion.

(9) Determination of Prizewinners.

(a) A ticket having a play symbol and corresponding play symbol caption in the “YOUR NUMBERS” play area that matches a play symbol and corresponding play symbol caption in the “WINNING NUMBERS” play area shall entitle the claimant to the corresponding prize shown for that symbol. A

(10) \$5,000,000 Top Prize and \$1,000,000 Prize Payment Options.

(a) A winner of a \$5,000,000 top prize or \$1,000,000 prize may choose one of two payment options for receiving his or her prize. Payment options are “Cash Option” or “Annual Payment.” At the time the \$5,000,000 top prize or \$1,000,000 is claimed, the terminal will produce a player claim instructions ticket. The winner has sixty (60) days from the date the player claim instructions ticket is produced to file a claim choosing the Cash Option. If a winner does not choose the Cash Option within the sixty (60) day timeframe, the Annual Payment option will be applied. Once the winner files a claim and exercises the winner’s chosen option, the election of that option shall be final. The Annual Payment method of payment will also be final when it is applied due to a top prize winner not making his or her payment election within sixty (60) days after the player claim instructions ticket is produced.

(b) Cash Option prizes will be paid in a single cash payment.

1. A winner of a \$5,000,000 top prize who elects the Cash Option shall receive a single cash payment of \$3,550,000, less applicable federal income tax withholding.

2. A winner of a \$1,000,000 prize who elects the Cash Option shall receive a single cash payment of \$710,000, less applicable federal income tax withholding.

(c) Annual Payment prizes will be paid in twenty-five (25) equal annual installments.

1. A winner of a \$5,000,000 top prize who elects the Annual Payment option shall receive annual installments of \$200,000 per year, less applicable federal withholding taxes.

2. A winner of a \$1,000,000 prize who elects the Annual Payment option shall receive annual installments of \$40,000 per year, less applicable federal withholding taxes.

(d) Any interest or earnings accruing on a \$5,000,000 top prize or a \$1,000,000 prize prior to the prize payment shall accrue to the Florida Lottery and not to the winner.
