(1) The Council shall, upon receipt of an in-State institution’s complete application to participate in SARA, approve the institution to participate in SARA on a provisional status if the institution meets the requirements of this rule chapter, but also meets one of the following:

(a) The Institution is on provisional or probationary status or the equivalent with its institutional Accrediting Agency; Is on probationary status or the equivalent with its institutional accrediting association;

(b) The Institution is currently required by the U.S. Department of Education to post a letter of credit or is under a cash management agreement with the U.S. Department of Education (Such institutions must still have a Federal Financial Responsibility Composite Score of 1.0 or above.); Uses a letter of credit or is under a cash management agreement with the U.S. Department of Education;

(c) The Institution has a Federal Financial Responsibility Composite Score between 1.0 and 1.5; Is the subject of a publicly announced investigation by a government agency, and the investigation is related to the institution’s academic quality, financial stability, or student consumer protection, or

(d) The Institution is the subject of a publicly announced investigation by a government agency, and the investigation is related to the institution’s academic quality, financial stability or student consumer protection; Is the subject of an investigation by the State related to the institution’s academic quality, financial stability, or student consumer protection.

(e) The Institution is the subject of a current investigation by its Home State relating to the institution’s academic quality, financial stability or student consumer protection;

(f) However, a third-party action such as a private lawsuit or news story does not by itself establish a government investigation. If such a third-party event results in an investigation by a government agency as set forth in subsections d and e above, these subsections become applicable. Lawsuits by government entities are considered to have resulted from a governmental investigation and can be the basis of a determination of Provisional Status.

RULE NO.: 68-1.012  
 RULE TITLE: Verification of Residency for the Purpose of Recreational Licenses and Permits

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The purpose of this rule is to set forth the ways in which a customer’s residency is verified when using the Commission’s online and telephone recreational licensing systems and when presenting proof of residency in-person to a Commission licensing subagent. The effect of the new rule would be to provide further clarification to the methods of residency verification available when customers apply for recreational licenses and permits.

SUMMARY: This rule provides that individuals applying for a resident recreational hunting or fishing license or permit using the Commission’s online licensing system or telephone licensing system must provide either a valid Florida driver license or an identification card that has both a Florida address and Florida residency verified by the Florida Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles as proof of residency. The rule further provides that individuals applying for a resident recreational hunting or fishing license or permit in person at a Commission licensing subagent or a tax collector’s office may prove residency by one of these two methods, or that in the absence of these documents may use one of the following documents to prove residency: a current Florida voter information card; a sworn statement manifesting and evidencing domicile in Florida in accordance with Section 222.17, F.S.; proof of a current Florida homestead exemption; for a child younger than 18 years of age, a student identification card from a Florida school or, if accompanied by his or her parent at the time of purchase, the parent’s proof of residency; for members of the United States Armed Forces stationed in Florida and family members who reside with such member, Armed Forces orders stationing the member in Florida; or for resident aliens, both documentation from the Bureau of Citizenship and Immigration Services evidencing permanent residency status in the United States; and one additional valid proof of residency listed above.

68-1.012 Verification of Residency for the Purpose of Recreational Licenses and Permits

For the purpose of providing proof of residency to obtain a resident recreational license, permit, or authorization, customers must submit one form of documentation as indicated below.

(1) When using the Commission’s online licensing system or when ordering by telephone:

- (a) A valid Florida driver license; or
- (b) An identification card that has both a Florida address and a Florida residency verified by the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles.
