5CER20-5 Temporary Restrictions on the Importation

of Lagomorphs

SPECIFIC REASONS FOR FINDING AN IMMEDIATE DANGER TO THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY OR WELFARE: On March 24, 2020, the United States Department of Agriculture, National Veterinary Services Laboratories, Foreign Animal Disease Diagnostic Laboratory (NVSL-FADDL) detected Rabbit Hemorrhagic Diseases Virus Type 2

(RHDV2), via PCR from samples submitted from two domestic rabbits from New Mexico.

Since March 1, 2020, there have been reports of wild rabbit deaths in southern New Mexico. Reports of domestic and wild lagomorph mortality in additional States in the region soon followed these initial detections. From March 24, 2020 to the present, RHDV2 has been confirmed in domestic rabbits from New Mexico, Arizona, Texas, Colorado, Nevada, and Utah, in wild rabbits and hares in New Mexico, Arizona, Texas, Colorado, California, and Nevada, and in feral rabbits in Colorado and Utah.

RHDV2 is a highly contagious and lethal form of a viral hepatitis that affects members of the order Lagomorpha and includes rabbits, hares and pikas. Generally, the only signs of the disease are sudden death and blood-stained noses caused by internal bleeding. Infected rabbits may also develop a fever, be hesitant to eat, or show respiratory or nervous signs. There is currently no approved vaccine for use in the United States and no specific treatment for the disease.

REASON FOR CONCLUDING THAT THE PROCEDURE IS FAIR UNDER THE CIRCUMSTANCES: This rule is fair and justified because it takes only the necessary actions to protect the public health, safety, and welfare by preventing the introduction and spread of this dangerous and transmissible disease and its vectors. The rule requires that Lagomorphs intended for movement into Florida be inspected seventy (72) hours prior to entry in this state by a veterinarian and be free from clinical signs of the disease. The Department is undertaking an aggressive campaign to notify the public about the implementation of this rule. The Department is currently in the process of amending Chapter 5C-3, F.A.C., through formal rulemaking to incorporate similar provisions for a more permanent solution.

SUMMARY: This rule places restrictions upon the importation of Lagomorphs to ensure they have not been exposed to a known or suspected case of Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease or infested and show no clinical signs of the disease. The requirements in this rule are in addition to the import requirements set forth in Chapter 5C-3, Florida Administrative Code.

<u>5CER20-5 Temporary Restrictions on the Importation of Lagomorphs.</u>

- (1) Definitions.
- (a) Lagomorph. Any member of the taxonomic order Lagomorpha.
- (b) Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease (RHD). A highly fatal hemorrhagic disease of rabbits and other lagomorphs caused by viruses in the family Caliciviridae, primarily Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease Virus and Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease Virus 2.
- (2) All Lagomorphs originating from a state that has had RHD diagnosed in wild or domestic animals in the past 30 months, are required to be accompanied by an Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection which must include the statement in (3) and be dated within seventy-two (72) hours prior to entry into Florida.
- (3) The OCVI must include the following statement from the examining veterinarian, "All animals on this shipment have not been exposed to a known or suspected case of RHD and show no clinical signs of diseases on the inspection date of (inspection/examination date)."

SUMMARY: This emergency rule describes Game Number 1474, "HOLIDAY CASH BLOWOUT," for which the Department of the Lottery will start selling tickets on a date to be determined by the Secretary of the Department. The rule sets forth the specifics of the game; determination of prizewinners; estimated odds of winning, value and number of prizes in the game.

- (1) Name of Game. Game Number 1474, HOLIDAY CASH BLOWOUT.
- (2) Game Number 1474, HOLIDAY CASH BLOWOUT is a Scratch-Off lottery game (also known as an instant lottery game).
- (3) Price. HOLIDAY CASH BLOWOUT lottery tickets sell for \$10.00 per ticket.
- (4) HOLIDAY CASH BLOWOUT lottery tickets shall have a series of numbers in machine readable code (or bar code) on the back of the ticket, along with a validation number under the latex area on the ticket. To be a valid winning HOLIDAY

CASH BLOWOUT lottery ticket, the ticket must meet the applicable requirements of Rule 53ER20-77, Payment of Prizes, F.A.C.

(9) Determination of Prizewinners.

(a) A ticket having a play symbol and corresponding play symbol caption in the YOUR GIFT NUMBERS play area that matches a play symbol and corresponding play symbol caption in the WINNING GIFT NUMBERS play area shall entitle the prizewinner to the corresponding prize shown for that symbol.

A ticket having a symbol in the YOUR GIFT NUMBERS play area shall entitle the prizewinner to a prize of \$50. A ticket

having a symbol in the YOUR GIFT NUMBERS play area shall entitle the prizewinner to a prize of \$100. A ticket

having a symbol in the YOUR GIFT NUMBERS play area shall entitle the prizewinner to a prize of \$500.

(b) A player may win up to twenty times on a ticket.

SUMMARY: The Department of the Lottery will conduct the Holiday Bonus Play Promotion beginning October 26, 2020, and continuing through January 4, 2021, in which two second chance drawings will be held, and cash prizes and gift cards awarded.

THE FULL TEXT OF THE EMERGENCY RULE IS:

53ER20-86 Holiday Bonus Play Promotion.

(1) Beginning October 26, 2020 and continuing through January 4, 2021, ("Promotion Period") the Florida Lottery will conduct the Holiday Bonus Play Promotion ("Promotion") in which players can enter winning and non-winning FLORIDA LOTTO® Draw Game tickets purchased during the Promotion Period ("qualifying FLORIDA LOTTO ticket"), and non-winning Florida Lottery Scratch-Off tickets (also known as instant tickets) from the following holiday games into a Holiday Bonus Play second chance drawing for a chance to win a cash prize or gift card:

- (a) Game Number 1471, \$10,000 HOLIDAY CASH;
- (b) Game Number 1472; NATIONAL LAMPOON'S CHRISTMAS VACATION™
 - (c) Game Number 1473, \$1,000,000 MONEY TREE;
- (d) Game Number 1474, HOLIDAY CASH BLOWOUT; and

(e) Game Number 1470, 200X THE CASH.

Winning and non-winning FLORIDA LOTTO® Draw Game tickets purchased during the Promotion Period, and non-winning Scratch-Off lottery tickets from the five above-listed Holiday Scratch-Off games may be entered throughout the entire Promotion Period for entry into the next available drawing. Winning Scratch-Off lottery tickets from the above-listed Holiday Scratch-Off games cannot be used for entry into a Holiday Bonus Play second chance drawing.

(2) How to Enter.

(a) A player may enter a winning or non-winning qualifying FLORIDA LOTTO Draw game ticket or a non-winning Holiday Scratch-Off lottery ticket on the Florida Lottery's website at flalottery.com or using the Florida Lottery's Mobile Convenience App ("App"). On the home page of the Florida Lottery's website, players are to click on the Promotions banner, select the Holiday Bonus Play Promotion and follow the directions. Players will be prompted to log-in or register. On the App, players may click on either of the

Promotions buttons, log-in, select the Holiday Bonus Play Promotion and follow the directions. A Promotions button is located on the main menu and also on the bottom navigation bar. A player may only create one account. Any attempt by a player to use more than one account by using multiple or different email addresses, identities, registrations, logins, or any other methods will subject the player and any associated entries to disqualification.

(b) On the ticket entry page, players are to enter the entire FLORIDA LOTTO or Holiday Scratch-Off ticket serial number in the designated ticket entry area on the website or scan the ticket barcode using the App.

1. For FLORIDA LOTTO Draw Game tickets, the 19-digit ticket serial number is located on the front of the ticket near the bottom. The ticket barcode is also located on the front of the ticket at the bottom.

2. For Holiday Scratch-Off tickets, players are to scratch off the latex covering on the front of the ticket to reveal the 24-digit ticket serial number (4-digit game number and 20-digit ticket number) and the ticket barcode. The ticket serial number is located below the play area on the front of the ticket and the ticket barcode is also located on the front of the ticket.

(c) Entry Determination. Each qualifying FLORIDA LOTTO Draw Game ticket and non-winning Holiday Scratch-Off lottery ticket is assigned a predetermined number of entries. A FLORIDA LOTTO ticket will receive five (5) entries, regardless of the total ticket purchase price. The number of entries for a Holiday Scratch-Off ticket corresponds to the price of the non-winning ticket, as shown in the table below.

Each valid FLORIDA LOTTO Draw Game ticket and each valid non-winning Holiday Scratch-Off ticket number may only be scanned or entered one time and only into one drawing during the Promotion Period. Tickets should not be mailed to the Florida Lottery unless players are contacted by the Florida Lottery and requested to do so. Lottery tickets received in the

mail by the Florida Lottery will not be entered into a drawing and will not be returned. The odds of winning depend on the number of entries entered. All entries are subject to validation by the Florida Lottery and may be disqualified if eligibility requirements are not met.

(3) Promo Codes. Various promo codes will be available to players during the Promotion via social media platforms, websites, emails, commercials and TV touchpoints. A player may earn five (5) additional entries by entering a promo code at the time the player enters a qualifying FLORIDA LOTTO Draw Game ticket number or non-winning Holiday Scratch-Off ticket number into a drawing. A qualifying FLORIDA LOTTO Draw Game ticket number or a non-winning Holiday Scratch-Off ticket number must be entered to enable the promo code feature on the entry page, and the ticket number and the promo code must be entered at the same time. Promo codes must be manually entered and cannot be scanned for entry. Each promo code is only valid for the corresponding entry period for which it is designated and can only be entered one time. However, more than one different promo code may be entered with a different qualifying FLORIDA LOTTO Draw Game ticket or a different non-winning Holiday Scratch-Off ticket number during the corresponding entry period for which it is designated.

(4) Prizes. The following table sets forth the prizes available in the Promotion.

(5) Drawings. A total of two drawings will be held. Prizewinners for each drawing will be randomly selected from entries submitted and received before midnight ET on the last day of the entry period for that drawing. The entry periods, drawing dates and winner announcement dates are set forth in the table below. Drawings shall be held in Tallahassee, Florida, and witnessed by an accountant employed by an independent certified public accounting firm.

In each of the drawings, a total of 418 valid entries will be drawn by the Florida Lottery using a certified random number generation process. The first valid entry drawn will win the top prize of \$25,000. The second and third valid entries drawn will each win a second prize of \$10,000. The fourth through the eighth valid entries drawn will each win a third prize of \$5,000. The ninth through the eighteenth valid entries drawn will each win a fourth prize of \$2,500. The nineteenth through the two hundred and sixty-eighth valid entries drawn will each win a fifth prize of a \$1,000 The Home Depot® gift card. The remaining entries drawn will be used in the order in which they were drawn and in the order of need to select an alternate top, second, third or fourth prize winner in the event a top, second, third or fourth prize cannot be awarded. Alternate entries will not be drawn or used for fifth prizes.

(6) Prizewinner Notification.

(a) The prizewinners in each second chance drawing will be posted on flalottery.com on the announcement date set forth in the table in subsection (5) above for the related drawing, or as soon thereafter as practicable.

(b) The Florida Lottery will attempt to notify each prizewinner by telephone or email using the contact information provided in the prizewinner's registration data no later than one business day (Monday-Friday) after the prizewinners are posted on the Florida Lottery's website. The Florida Lottery deems the winner's registration data as the prizewinner's official contact information, including the physical mailing address. The Florida Lottery will not attempt to further locate a prizewinner if the attempt to reach the winner by telephone or email is unsuccessful. If the Florida Lottery is unable to have contact by telephone or email with a prizewinner within seven calendar days of the date the prizewinners are posted on the website, the winner will forfeit his or her right to claim the prize and the Florida Lottery will award the prize to an alternate prizewinner in accordance with subsection (5) above. For top, second, third and fourth prizes, if the Florida Lottery is unable to have contact by email or telephone with the alternate prizewinner within seven calendar days of the date of notification, the alternate prizewinner will forfeit his or her right to claim the prize and the Florida Lottery will award the prize to the next alternate prizewinner. This process will continue until an alternate prizewinner is contacted or the Florida Lottery has exhausted the list of alternate prizewinners

due to unsuccessful notification attempts or due to failure by a prizewinner or an alternate prizewinner to timely provide required claim documentation as set forth in subsection (7) below. If the Florida Lottery exhausts the list of alternate prizewinners, the prize will not be awarded.

(7) How to Claim a Prize. To claim any prize in a second chance drawing, the prizewinner must submit to the Florida Lottery a completed Winner Claim Form DOL 173-2, revised 2/18, or Spanish Winner Claim Form DOL 173-2S, revised 3/19 and a copy of acceptable identification. Forms DOL 173-2 and DOL 173-2S are hereby incorporated by reference and may be obtained at any Florida Lottery office or retailer, from the Florida Lottery's website at flalottery.com, or by writing to: Florida Lottery, Customer Service, 250 Marriott Drive, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-4016. Acceptable identification is set forth in the rule of the Florida Lottery governing payment of prizes. A copy of the current prize payment rule can be obtained from the Florida Lottery, Office of the General Counsel, 250 Marriott Drive, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-4011. For all prizes, the required documentation must be received by any Florida Lottery office no later than fourteen calendar days after the Florida Lottery has made personal contact with the prizewinner. If the Florida Lottery has not received the required documentation from a prizewinner by the fourteenth calendar day after notification, the prizewinner will forfeit his or her right to claim the prize. For top, second, third and fourth prizes, the Florida Lottery will award the prize to an alternate prizewinner in accordance with subsections (5) and (6) above. The same timeframe for a prizewinner to return required documentation to the Florida Lottery shall apply to an alternate prizewinner. A prizewinner in this Promotion is not required to submit to the Florida Lottery the FLORIDA LOTTO Draw Game ticket or the Holiday Scratch-Off ticket that he or she used to generate an entry into the drawing in order to claim a prize.

(8) Award of Top Prizes. Upon the Florida Lottery's timely receipt of a top prize winner's required documentation, the Lottery will award a top prize of \$25,000, less applicable federal income tax withholding.

(9) Award of Second Prizes. Upon the Florida Lottery's timely receipt of a second prize winner's required documentation, the Lottery will award a second prize of \$10,000, less applicable federal income tax withholding.

(10) Award of Third Prizes. Upon the Florida Lottery's timely receipt of a third prize winner's required documentation, the Lottery will award a third prize of \$5,000.

(11) Award of Fourth Prizes. Upon the Florida Lottery's timely receipt of a fourth prize winner's required documentation, the Lottery will award a fourth prize of \$2,500.

- (12) Award of Fifth Prizes. Upon the Florida Lottery's timely receipt of a fifth prize winner's required documentation, the Lottery will award a fifth prize of a \$1,000 The Home Depot Gift Card.
- (13) Taxes. Except as specifically described herein, all federal, state and/or local taxes or other fees on the prizes won in the Holiday Bonus Play Promotion will be the responsibility of the prizewinner. Thirty percent federal income tax withholding will be withheld from any cash prize won by a nonresident alien prizewinner in the Promotion, regardless of the amount of the prize. For fifth prizes, a nonresident alien claimant will be required to pay the federal income withholding tax on the value of the prize or forfeit the prize. The reporting and subsequent payment of any additional federal, state and/or local taxes shall be the responsibility of the nonresident alien prizewinner.

(14) Other Restrictions and Provisions.

- (a) All prizes are subject to the provisions of Chapter 24, Florida Statutes, and rules promulgated thereunder. Prizes shall be paid in accordance with the rule of the Florida Lottery governing payment of prizes. A copy of the current prize payment rule can be obtained from the Florida Lottery, Office of the General Counsel, 250 Marriott Drive, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-4011.
- (b) Top, second, third and fourth prizewinners will be analyzed for state-owed debt. If a prizewinner is identified as owing an outstanding debt to any state agency or owes child support collected through a court, the debt will be offset in accordance with section 24.115(4), Florida Statutes. If the debt is an amount less than the amount of the prize, the balance of the prize after deduction of the debt shall be awarded. If the debt is an amount greater than the amount of the prize, the entire prize amount will be applied to the outstanding debt.
- (c) Players must be at least 18 years of age. Persons prohibited by section 24.116, Florida Statutes, from purchasing a Florida Lottery ticket are not eligible to enter the Holiday Bonus Play Promotion.
- (d) By entering the Holiday Bonus Play Promotion, a player gives his or her permission for the Florida Lottery to photograph and/or videotape and record the prizewinner with or without prior notification and to use the name, photograph, videotape, and/or recording of the prizewinner for advertising or publicity purposes without additional compensation.

Furthermore, the Division finds that the Petitioner meets the burden of demonstrating that the underlying statute has been achieved by the Petitioner ensuring that each pan within the steam table is properly covered with an individual lid; the steam table is enclosed within a cabinet with tight-fitting doors, and is protected by an air curtain installed and operated according to the manufacturer's specifications that protects against flying vermin or other environmental contaminants; all steam table foods must be properly reheated for hot holding at approved commissaries and held hot at the proper minimum temperature per the parameters of the currently adopted FDA Food Code; and steam table food is to be dispensed by the operator with no customer self-service. The Petitioner shall also strictly adhere to the operating procedures and copies of the variance and operating procedures are to be present on the MFDV during all periods of operation.

FINAL ORDER

APPROVING CITY OF MARATHON ORDINANCE NO. 2019-09

The Department of Economic Opportunity ("Department") hereby issues its Final Order, pursuant to subsections 380.05(6), Florida Statutes, approving land development regulations adopted by the City of Marathon, Florida, Ordinance No. 2019-09 (the "Ordinance").

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The Florida Keys Area is designated by Section 380.0552, Florida Statutes, as an area of critical state concern. The City of Marathon ("City") is a local government within the Florida Keys Area.
- 2. The Ordinance was adopted by the City on August 13, 2019, and rendered to the Department on August 26, 2020.
- 3. The Ordinance amends several sections of the Land Development Code to provide for the rebuilding or

replacement of existing single-family residences on nonconforming lots and to allow the development of singlefamily residences on vacant lots in certain blocks within the Residential Low Conservation zoning district.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 4. The Department is required to approve or reject land development regulations that are adopted by any local government in an area of critical state concern. *See* § 380.05(6), Fla. Stat.
- 5. "Land development regulations" include local zoning, subdivision, building, and other regulations controlling the development of land. § 380.031(8), Fla. Stat. The regulations adopted by the Ordinance are land development regulations.
- 6. The Ordinance is consistent with the City's Comprehensive Plan as required by subsection 163.3177(1), Florida Statutes, generally, and is specifically consistent with Policy 1-3.2.7 of the Plan.
- 7. All land development regulations enacted, amended, or rescinded within an area of critical state concern must be consistent with the principles for guiding development for that area. *See* § 380.05(6), Fla. Stat. The Principles for Guiding Development for the Florida Keys Area of Critical State Concern are set forth in subsection 380.0552(7), Florida Statutes.
- 8. The Ordinance is consistent with the Principles for Guiding Development of the Florida Keys Area of Critical State Concern as a whole, and is specifically consistent with the following principles:
- (a) Strengthening local government capabilities for managing land use and development so that local government is able to achieve these objectives without continuing the area of critical state concern designation; and
- (d) Ensuring the maximum well-being of the Florida Keys and its citizens through sound economic development.

WHEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the Department finds that the City of Marathon Ordinance No. 2019-09 is consistent with the City of Marathon Comprehensive Plan and the Principles for Guiding Development for the Florida Keys Area of Critical State Concern, and is hereby <u>APPROVED</u>.

This Order becomes effective 21 days after publication in the *Florida Administrative Register* unless a petition is timely filed as described in the Notice of Administrative Rights below.
