PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The purpose of these rules amendments is to provide additional conservation of

diamondback terrapins (Malaclemys terrapin) that may encounter blue crab traps.

The effect of the rule amendments would be to reduce bycatch of diamondback terrapins in blue crab traps by modifying blue crab trap gear requirements to require a maximum rigid throat size in recreational blue crab traps year-round and statewide, and to require a maximum rigid throat size in commercial blue crab traps within specific Terrapin Bycatch Reduction Zones (TBRZ) seasonally by January 1, 2024.

SUMMARY: These rules would implement a statewide and year-round requirement for recreational blue crab traps to have a maximum rigid throat size of 2 inches by 6 inches, which could be achieved by installing a bycatch reduction device. These rules would also implement a seasonal and regional requirement for commercial blue crab traps to have a maximum rigid throat size of 2 inches by 6 inches, which could be achieved by installing a bycatch reduction device. The season for the commercial requirement would be March 1 through October 31 of each year, and would apply in five Terrapin Bycatch Reduction Zones (TBRZs). The TBRZs would be located in the Big Bend, Tampa Bay, Charlotte Harbor, the Banana River, and Northeast Florida. The rule amendments would make the recreational and commercial gear requirements effective January 1, 2024.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

68B-45.002 Definitions.

As used in this rule chapter:

- (1) "Banana River TBRZ" means all waters of Sykes Creek south of State Road 528, and all waters of the Banana River south of Merritt Island National Wildlife Refuge and north of Banana River Daybeacon 1 (28°08.512' N Latitude), but excluding all waters of the Canaveral Barge Canal.
- (2) "Big Bend TBRZ" means all Florida Waters that lie between a line 2.5 nautical miles inside of and parallel to the three nautical mile line, as depicted or described on NOAA nautical charts for coastal Florida waters, and a line 10 nautical miles inside of and parallel to the three nautical mile line extending from 29°56.046' N Latitude in Franklin County to the Hernando-Pasco county line.
- (3)(1) "Blue crab" means any crustacean of the species *Callinectes sapidus*, or any part thereof.
- (4) "Bycatch reduction device" or "BRD" means a rigid rectangular device or implement that forms the perimeter of the opening of a throat or entrance to a trap used to harvest blue crabs or peeler crabs and is intended to minimize bycatch of diamondback terrapins by limiting the size of the opening.
- (5) "Charlotte Harbor TBRZ" means all inside waters of Charlotte and Lee counties east of Boca Grande Causeway and west of County Road 865 (San Carlos Boulevard), and includes Gasparilla Sound, Charlotte Harbor, Peace River, Pine Island Sound, Caloosahatchee River, and all connecting inside waters.
- (6)(2) "Drop net" means a small, usually circular, net with weights attached along the outer edge and a single float in the center.
 - (3) through (8) renumbered as (7) through (12).
- (13) "Northeast Florida TBRZ" means all inside waters of Duval County north of State Road 105 and east of Interstate 95 and all inside waters of Nassau County east of Interstate 95 and south of the Florida-Georgia state line.
 - (9) through (15) renumbered as (14) through (20).

- (21) "Tampa Bay TBRZ" means all connecting inside waters of Tampa Bay bounded by County Road 682 in Pinellas County and State Road 684 in Manatee County.
 - (22) "TBRZ" means Terrapin Bycatch Reduction Zone.
 - (16) and (17) renumbered as (23) and (24).

68B-45.004 Regulation and Prohibition of Certain Harvesting Gear.

- (1) Except as provided in subsections (2), (3), (4), (5) and (6), below, the following types of gear shall be the only types of gear allowed for the harvest of blue crab in or from state waters:
 - (a) Traps meeting the following specifications:
 - 1. through 5. No change.
- 6. Each throat (entrance) in any trap used to harvest blue crabs shall be horizontally oriented, i.e., the width of the opening where the throat meets the vertical wall of the trap and the opening of the throat at its farthest point from the vertical wall, inside the trap, is greater than the height of any such opening. No such throat shall extend farther than 6 inches into the inside of any trap, measured from the opening where the throat meets the vertical wall of the trap to the opening of the throat at its farthest point from the vertical wall, inside the trap. Beginning January 1, 2024, each throat or entrance in a trap used to harvest blue crabs shall comply with terrapin bycatch reduction requirements as provided in subsection (8).
 - 7. No change
- (2)(a) Peeler crabs may be harvested in traps constructed of wire with a minimum mesh size of one inch and with the throats or entrances located only on a vertical surface. Such traps shall have a maximum dimension of 24 inches by 24 inches by 24 inches or a volume of 8 cubic feet and a degradable panel.
- (b) Each trap used to harvest peeler crabs shall have buoys and be identified as described in subparagraph (a)2., and (a)3. or (a)4.
- (c) All peeler crabs harvested must be kept in a container separate from other blue crabs.
- (d) Each trap used to harvest peeler crabs shall only be baited with live male blue crabs. Male crabs so used as bait to attract female blue crabs into peeler traps may be periodically fed with no more than a single bait fish. Any trap used to harvest blue crabs that is baited with anything other than live male blue crabs shall meet the requirements of paragraph (1)(a), of this rule.
- (e) Beginning January 1, 2024, each entrance or throat in a trap used to harvest peeler crabs shall comply with terrapin bycatch reduction requirements as provided in subsection (8).
 - (3) through (7) No change.

- (8) Terrapin bycatch reduction requirements.
- (a) Recreational harvesters. Beginning January 1, 2024, each trap used to harvest blue crabs, other than those used to harvest for commercial purposes, must contain a bycatch reduction device that meets the specifications of paragraph (8)(c) installed in each entrance or throat.
- (b) Commercial harvesters. Beginning January 1, 2024, each trap used to harvest blue crabs for commercial purposes from March 1 through October 31 each year within the following Terrapin Bycatch Reduction Zones must contain a bycatch reduction device that meets the specifications of paragraph (8)(c) installed in each entrance or throat: Banana River TBRZ, Big Bend TBRZ, Charlotte Harbor TBRZ, Northeast Florida TBRZ, and Tampa Bay TBRZ.
- (c) A trap shall be considered to meet the requirements of paragraphs (8)(a) or (8)(b) if each entrance or throat:
- 1. Contains a bycatch reduction device measuring no larger than 2 inches in height by 6 inches in width; or,
- 2. Is constructed completely of rigid wire such that the narrowest opening does not exceed 2 inches in height by 6 inches in width.

NOTICE OF RIGHTS

As required by Sections 120.569(1), and 120.60(3), Fla. Stat., the following is notice of the opportunities which may be available for administrative hearing or judicial review when the substantial interests of a party are determined by an agency. Please note that this Notice of Rights is not intended to provide legal advice. Not all of the legal proceedings detailed below may be an applicable or appropriate remedy. You may wish to consult an attorney regarding your legal rights.

Right to Request Administrative Hearing

A person whose substantial interests are or may be affected by the South Florida Water Management District's (SFWMD or District) action has the right to request an administrative hearing on that action pursuant to Sections 120.569 and 120.57, Fla. Stat. Persons seeking a hearing on a SFWMD decision which affects or may affect their substantial interests shall file a petition for hearing with the Office of the District Clerk of the SFWMD, in accordance with the filing instructions set forth herein, within 21 days of receipt of written notice of the decision, unless one of the following shorter time periods apply: (1) within 14 days of the notice of consolidated intent to grant or deny concurrently reviewed applications for environmental resource permits and use of sovereign submerged lands pursuant to Section 373.427, Fla. Stat.; or (2) within 14 days of service of an Administrative Order pursuant to subsection

373.119(1), Fla. Stat. "Receipt of written notice of agency decision" means receipt of written notice through mail, electronic mail, or posting that the SFWMD has or intends to take final agency action, or publication of notice that the SFWMD has or intends to take final agency action. Any person who receives written notice of a SFWMD decision and fails to file a written request for hearing within the timeframe described above waives the right to request a hearing on that decision.

If the District takes final agency action which materially differs from the noticed intended agency decision, persons who may be substantially affected shall, unless otherwise provided by law, have an additional Rule 28-106.111, Fla. Admin. Code, point of entry.

Any person to whom an emergency order is directed pursuant to Section 373.119(2), Fla. Stat., shall comply therewith immediately, but on petition to the board shall be afforded a hearing as soon as possible.

A person may file a request for an extension of time for filing a petition. The SFWMD may, for good cause, grant the request. Requests for extension of time must be filed with the SFWMD prior to the deadline for filing a petition for hearing. Such requests for extension shall contain a certificate that the moving party has consulted with all other parties concerning the extension and that the SFWMD and any other parties agree to or oppose the extension. A timely request for an extension of time shall toll the running of the time period for filing a petition until the request is acted upon.

FILING INSTRUCTIONS

A petition for administrative hearing must be filed with the Office of the District Clerk of the SFWMD. Filings by facsimile will not be accepted. A petition for administrative hearing or other document is deemed filed upon receipt during normal business hours by the Office of the District Clerk at SFWMD headquarters in West Palm Beach, Florida. The District's normal business hours are 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m., excluding weekends and District holidays. Any document received by the Office of the District Clerk after 5:00 p.m. shall be deemed filed as of 8:00 a.m. on the next regular business day. Additional filing instructions are as follows:

Filings by mail must be addressed to the Office of the District Clerk, 3301 Gun Club Road, West Palm Beach, Florida 33406. Filings by hand-delivery must be delivered to the Office of the District Clerk. Delivery of a petition to the SFWMD's security desk does not constitute filing. It will be necessary to request that the SFWMD's security officer contact the Office of the District Clerk. An employee of the SFWMD's Clerk's office will receive and file the petition.

Filings by e-mail must be transmitted to the Office of the District Clerk at clerk@sfwmd.gov. The filing date for a document transmitted by electronic mail shall be the date the Office of the District Clerk receives the complete document. A party who files a document by e-mail shall (1) represent that the original physically signed document will be retained by that party for the duration of the proceeding and of any subsequent appeal or subsequent proceeding in that cause and that the party shall produce it upon the request of other parties; and (2) be responsible for any delay, disruption, or interruption of the electronic signals and accepts the full risk that the document may not be properly filed.

INITIATION OF AN ADMINISTRATIVE HEARING

Pursuant to Sections 120.54(5)(b)4. and 120.569(2)(c), Fla. Stat., and Rules 28-106.201 and 28-106.301, Fla. Admin. Code, initiation of an administrative hearing shall be made by written petition to the SFWMD in legible form and on 8 1/2 by 11inch white paper. All petitions shall contain:

- 1. Identification of the action being contested, including the permit number, application number, SFWMD file number or any other SFWMD identification number, if known.
- 2. The name, address, any email address, any facsimile number, and telephone number of the petitioner and petitioner's representative, if any.
- 3. An explanation of how the petitioner's substantial interests will be affected by the agency determination.
- 4. A statement of when and how the petitioner received notice of the SFWMD's decision.
- 5. A statement of all disputed issues of material fact. If there are none, the petition must so indicate.
- 6. A concise statement of the ultimate facts alleged, including the specific facts the petitioner contends warrant reversal or modification of the SFWMD's proposed action.
- 7. A statement of the specific rules or statutes the petitioner contends require reversal or modification of the SFWMD's proposed action.
- 8. If disputed issues of material fact exist, the statement must also include an explanation of how the alleged facts relate to the specific rules or statutes.
- 9. A statement of the relief sought by the petitioner, stating precisely the action the petitioner wishes the SFWMD to take with respect to the SFWMD's proposed action.

MEDIATION

The procedures for pursuing mediation are set forth in Section 120.573, Fla. Stat., and Rules 28-106.111 and 28-106.401-.405, Fla. Admin. Code. The SFWMD is not proposing mediation for this agency action under Section 120.573, Fla. Stat., at this time.

RIGHT TO SEEK JUDICIAL REVIEW

Pursuant to Section 120.68, Fla. Stat., and in accordance with Florida Rule of Appellate Procedure 9.110, a party who is adversely affected by final SFWMD action may seek judicial review of the SFWMD's final decision by filing a notice of appeal with the Office of the District Clerk of the SFWMD in accordance with the filing instructions set forth herein within 30 days of rendition of the order to be reviewed, and by filing a copy of the notice with the clerk of the appropriate district court of appeal.
