DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH

RULE NO.: 64ER22-9
RULE TITLE: Application for MMTC Licensure

SPECIFIC REASONS FOR FINDING AN IMMEDIATE DANGER TO THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY OR WELFARE: Pursuant to Chapter 2022-157, § 18, Laws of Florida, the Department is not required to make findings of an immediate danger to the public, health, safety, or welfare.

REASON FOR CONCLUDING THAT THE PROCEDURE IS FAIR UNDER THE CIRCUMSTANCES: The Department of Health is directed by Chapter 2022-157, § 18, Laws of Florida, to adopt emergency rules to implement section 381.986, Florida Statutes.

SUMMARY: Emergency Rule 64ER22-9 repeals and replaces Emergency Rule 64ER17-2. This emergency rule establishes the medical marijuana treatment center application process for individuals or entities applying for licensure.

THE FULL TEXT OF THE EMERGENCY RULE IS:

64ER22-9 Application for MMTC Licensure.

(1) The following definitions apply to this emergency rule.

(a) "Batching cycle" means the grouping for comparative review of applications for MMTC licensure that are submitted for a specified number of available MMTC licenses within the same application window.

(b) "Application window" means the 5-day period during which the department will accept applications for a batching cycle, including the date and time upon which the department will begin accepting applications and the deadline (including the date and time) for submitting applications.

(2) Applications for MMTC licensure will be accepted in batching cycles established by the department. The department will establish MMTC batching cycles by separate rule which will specify:

(a) The application window for the application batching cycle; and

(b) The available number of MMTC licenses to be issued in the batching cycle.

(3) After the department's publication of an MMTC application batching cycle, any person that desires to apply for licensure as an MMTC must submit the following to the department during the application window:

(a) An application that complies with this rule and the instructions and requirements contained in Form DH8052-OMMU-12/12/2022, "Medical Marijuana Treatment Center License Application Instructions, Requirements, and Forms," which is incorporated by reference and available at <https://knowthefactsmmj.com/rules-and-regulations/>; and

(b) A non-refundable application fee in the amount of \$146,000.

(4) Applicants seeking to pay the application fee through a transfer of the initial application fee from the *Pigford/BFL* batching cycle pursuant to section 381.986(8)(a)2.b., F.S., must request the transfer by submitting a completed Form 6 of the "Medical Marijuana Treatment Center License Application Instructions, Requirements, and Forms."

(5) Applications for MMTC licensure will be evaluated and scored by evaluators as described in the "Medical Marijuana Treatment Center License Application Instructions, Requirements, and Forms." The evaluators will be provided Form DH8051-OMMU-12/12/2022, "Medical Marijuana Treatment Center Evaluator Instructions Manual," incorporated by reference herein and available at https://knowthefactsmmj.com/rules-and-regulations.

(6) An application for MMTC licensure will be considered only for the batching cycle in which it is submitted.

(7) If additional MMTC licenses become available before a final agency action on applications submitting during any given batching cycle, such additional licenses will be subject to and awarded through a separate batching cycle published by the department. An applicant will not be awarded an MMTC license from an application batching cycle in which the applicant did not apply.

64ER22-10: Renewal Application Requirements for MMTCs
SPECIFIC REASONS FOR FINDING AN IMMEDIATE DANGER TO THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY OR WELFARE: Pursuant to Chapter 2022-157, § 18, Laws of Florida, the Department is not required to make findings of an immediate danger to the public, health, safety, or welfare.

REASON FOR CONCLUDING THAT THE PROCEDURE IS FAIR UNDER THE CIRCUMSTANCES: The Department of Health is directed by Chapter 2022-157, § 18, Laws of Florida, to adopt emergency rules to implement section 381.986, Florida Statutes.

SUMMARY: This emergency rule replaces and supersedes Emergency Rule 64ER19-8 and establishes the requirements and process for the renewal of medical marijuana treatment center licenses and the renewal application form incorporated therein.

THE FULL TEXT OF THE EMERGENCY RULE IS:

64ER22-10 Renewal Application Requirements for MMTCs.

(1) Each MMTC seeking renewal of its MMTC license shall submit a renewal application to the department in compliance with Form DH8053-OMMU-12/12/2022 "Medical Marijuana Treatment Center Renewal Application Instructions, Requirements, and Forms," herein incorporated by reference and available at <https://knowthefactsmmj.com/rules-and-regulations/>, together with a renewal fee in the amount prescribed in subsection (9) below.

(2) Renewal applicants may not submit variance requests, pursuant to Rule 64-4.023, F.A.C., as part of the renewal application. Renewal applicants are prohibited from submitting as part of a renewal application any information that varies or changes the MMTC's initial application, as amended by variance requests approved by the department. Approval of a renewal application does not constitute a variance approval.

(3) The following are grounds for denial of a renewal application:

(a) Failure to submit the required renewal fee;

(b) Failure to provide information or documentation required by the "Medical Marijuana Treatment Center Renewal Application Instructions, Requirements, and Forms;"

(c) Failure to timely correct errors or omissions or supply required information to the department upon request made pursuant to s. 120.60, F.S.;

(d) Failure to meet minimum statutory requirements; or

(e) Any deficiencies or violations that are grounds for revocation or denial pursuant to statute or department rule.

(4) An MMTC seeking renewal must submit its renewal application at least 90 days, but not more than 120 days, before the end of the MMTC's effective license period. The effective license period is a two-year period measured from the date the MMTC license was initially issued, as indicated on the initial license. After the initial effective license period, the two-year period is measured from the effective date of MMTC license renewal, as indicated on the renewal license.

(5) An MMTC's renewal application, renewal fee, and supporting documentation must be delivered to the department's Agency Clerk, at the address provided in the "Medical Marijuana Treatment Center Renewal Application Instructions, Requirements, and Forms," no later than 5:00 p.m., eastern time, on the deadline established in subsection (4). If the deadline falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday, then the deadline shall extend to the next day which is not a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday.

(6) Renewal applications that are not received by the department's Agency Clerk, at the address provided in the "Medical Marijuana Treatment Center Renewal Application Instructions, Requirements, and Forms," on or before the date and time set forth in this rule will not be considered.

(7) The amount of the renewal fee will be calculated according to the following formula:

$$\frac{[(FY\ 1\ actual\ expenditures + FY\ 2\ actual\ expenditures) - (MMTC\ initial\ license\ application\ fees\ received\ during\ FY\ 1\ and\ FY\ 2)]}{Total\ number\ of\ licensed\ MMTCs} = MMTC\ renewal\ fee\ amount$$

(a) FY 1 and FY 2 are the two most recently completed state fiscal years that immediately precede the first day of the two-year calendar period during which renewal applications are due, as reflected in the Medical Marijuana Treatment Center Renewal Fee Schedule. For example, for renewal applications due between January 1, 2023, and December 31, 2024, FY 1 and FY 2 would be the state's fiscal years ending June 30, 2021, and June 30, 2022, respectively.

(b) For purposes of the formula, the total number of licensed MMTCs will be the number of licensed MMTCs as of the date the renewal fee is calculated.

(8) In establishing the renewal fee, the Department will review its records, Department of Financial Services records, and any other necessary state records to ascertain the actual amounts expended to implement and administer s. 381.986, F.S., during the applicable fiscal years and amounts received from MMTC initial license application fees during those same fiscal years.

(9) The renewal fee amount is contained in Form DH8054-OMMU-12/14/2022 "Medical Marijuana Treatment Center Renewal Fee Schedule," herein incorporated by reference and

available at <https://knowthefactsmmj.com/rules-and-regulations/>. Renewal fee amounts will be established for a period of two, consecutive calendar years for all renewal applications due during such calendar years.

(10) An MMTC must maintain compliance with department Emergency Rule 64ER22-1 during the effective license period.

(a) A student shall achieve a passing score, pursuant to subsection 11B-35.001(10), F.A.C., on all end-of-course examinations in a Commission-approved Basic Recruit Training Program or a Special Operations Forces Training Program to successfully complete a program. A student who has failed a written end-of-course examination may be granted a re-examination by the training center director if:

1. There is technical difficulty in the administration of the test.
2. A condition of the student adversely impacts the student's ability to achieve a passing score on an end-of-course examination.
3. The end-of-course testing instrument is shown to be invalid.

(b) Exclusive of the Commission's Basic Recruit Training Courses or the Special Operations Forces Training Program courses requiring proficiency demonstration and re-examinations in paragraph (13)(a) of this rule section, a student may be granted one written end-of-course re-examination during a single Basic Recruit Training Program or Special Operations Forces Training Program. Students, who have failed

the written end-of-course examination after a second attempt shall be deemed to have failed the course.

(c) The training center director is authorized to approve a student's request for re-examination.

The Department of Economic Opportunity (the “Department”) hereby issues its Final Order, pursuant to Section 380.05(6), Florida Statutes, approving land development regulations adopted by the City of Marathon (the “City”), Ordinance No. 2022-20 (the “Ordinance”).

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Florida Keys Area is designated by Section 380.0552, Florida Statutes, as an area of critical state concern. The City is a local government within the Florida Keys Area.
2. The Ordinance was adopted by the City on September 13, 2022 and rendered to the Department on September 20, 2022.
3. The Ordinance amends several sections and figures in the City’s Code of Ordinances to remove all references to the state land planning agency as the Department of Community Affairs and to update the state land planning agency’s name to the Department of Economic Opportunity.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

4. The Department is required to approve or reject land development regulations that are adopted by any local government in an area of critical state concern. *See* Section 380.05(6), Florida Statutes.
5. “Land development regulations” include local zoning, subdivision, building, and other regulations controlling the development of land. Section 380.031(8), Florida Statutes. The regulations adopted by the Ordinance are land development regulations.

6. The Ordinance is consistent with the City’s Comprehensive Plan as required by Section 163.3177(1), Florida Statutes, generally, and is specifically consistent with Goal 9-1, Objective 9-1.1, and Policy 9-1.3.7.

7. All land development regulations enacted, amended, or rescinded within an area of critical state concern must be consistent with the principles for guiding development for that area. *See* Section 380.05(6), Florida Statutes. The Principles for Guiding Development for the Florida Keys Area of Critical State Concern are set forth in Section 380.0552(7), Florida Statutes.

8. The Ordinance is consistent with the Principles for Guiding Development in Section 380.0552(7), Florida Statutes and is specifically consistent with the following Principles:

- (a) Strengthening local government capabilities for managing land use and development so that local government is able to achieve these objectives without continuing the area of critical state concern designation.

WHEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the Department finds that the City of Marathon Ordinance No. 2022-20 is consistent with the City of Marathon’s Comprehensive Plan and the Principles for Guiding Development for the Florida Keys Area of Critical State Concern and is hereby **APPROVED**.

This Final Order becomes final 21 days after publication in the Florida Administrative Register unless a petition is timely filed as described in the Notice of Administrative Rights below.
