PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The purpose of the amendment to Rule 59G-4.002, Florida Administrative Code, (F.A.C.), is to update fee schedules and billing codes in the existing rule.

SUMMARY: : The rule incorporates the July 1, 2022, Florida Medicaid fee schedules and billing codes and the January 1, 2023, Florida Medicaid fee schedules and billing codes by reference.

SUMMARY: The proposed rule amendment will clarify CME requirements including obtaining completion of CME in a distance learning format and approving an additional provider for the controlled substance prescribing course.

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

The Agency has determined that the proposed rule is not expected to require legislative ratification based on the statement of estimated regulatory costs or if no SERC is required, the information expressly relied upon and described herein: During discussion of the economic impact of this rule at its Board meeting, the Board concluded that this rule change will not have any impact on licensees and their businesses or the businesses that employ them. The rule will not increase any fees, business costs, personnel costs, will not decrease profit opportunities, and will not require any specialized knowledge to comply. This change will not increase any direct or indirect regulatory costs. 64B15-13.001 Continuing Education for Biennial Renewal.

Every person licensed pursuant to Chapter 459, F.S., except those licensed as physician assistants pursuant to Section 459.022, F.S., shall be required to complete forty (40) hours of continuing medical education courses approved by the Board in the twenty-four (24) months preceding each biennial renewal period as established by the Department. Continuing medical education (CME) requirements for biennial renewal of licensure are set forth in this rule. ~~For the 2022-2024 biennial renewal period, all of the~~ The CME required by this rule may be obtained by completion of courses offered in any format, including in a distance learning format, with the proviso in subsection (1)(a).

(1)(a) For each biennial renewal, a licensee shall complete a one (1) hour continuing medical education course in Florida Laws and Rules/Professional and Medical Ethics, and a two (2) hour course in Prevention of Medical Errors. For purposes of this rule, Florida Laws and Rules means Chapters 456 and 459, F.S., and rule Chapter 64B15, F.A.C. These CME courses may be obtained in any format, including in a distance learning format, provided that the format includes an ability to interact with the presenter of the course.

(b) A licensee shall not be required to complete continuing medical education if the initial license is issued subsequent to July 1 of the second year of the biennium, except such licensee is required to complete the CME in paragraph 64B15-13.001(1)(a), (d), and if applicable (e), F.A.C.

(c) through (d) No change.

(e) A licensee who is registered with the United States Drug Enforcement Agency and is authorized to prescribe controlled substances is required to complete a 2-hour course on prescribing controlled substances at each biennial renewal of licensure as required by Section 456.0301, F.S. The Board approves the controlled substance prescribing courses offered by the Florida Medical Association, the Florida Osteopathic Medical Association, the Florida Academy of Family Physicians, the Florida College of Emergency Physicians, Baptist Health South Florida/Quality Network, InforMed, Florida Psychiatric Society, NetCE, ~~and The Doctors Company, and TeamHealth Institute~~ for the purpose of meeting this continuing education requirement. ~~The course may be offered in a distance learning format.~~

IN RE: APPLICATION FOR A CHANGE IN RATES OF PILOTAGE FOR THE PORTS OF TAMPA BAY FILED BY THE TAMPA BAY PILOTS ASSOCIATION

To all interested parties: the Pilotage Rate Review Committee has determined that as of October 1, 2023, the rates of pilotage at the Ports of Tampa Bay are modified to the following:

1. Base Formula. The formula for calculating base pilotage rates shall be:

$$(LOA \times LOA \text{ Rate}) + (\text{Beam} \times \text{Beam Rate}) + (\text{Draft} \times \text{Draft Rate}) + (\text{GT} \times \text{GT Rate})$$

Definitions:

LOA = length overall

Beam = waterline beam

Draft = deepest draft

GT = Gross Tonnage. If multiple Gross Tonnages are listed, the maximum value will be used.

2. Base Rate. The initial base rate in dollars per foot or per Gross Tonnage for Arrivals and Sailings shall be:

Vessels of GT:	Up to 22,000 GT	Over 22,000 GT	Over 40,000 GT and 815 feet or Greater LOA	39 ft. or Greater Draft
LOA Rate	\$1.25	\$1.75	\$2.25	Applicable LOA rate
Beam Rate	\$7.50	\$10	\$17	Applicable Beam rate
Draft Rate	\$47.50	\$60	\$72	\$82
GT Rate	\$0.025	\$0.03	\$0.04	Applicable GT rate

Barges – The pilotage rate for a barge towed on a hawser, towed alongside or pushed (not a composite unit) is based on the sum of the LOA, Beam, Draft, and GT attributes of the towing tug and barge(s).

Tugs – The pilotage rate for a tug pushing a barge in the notch as a composite unit is based on the LOA, Beam, GT, and deepest draft of the combined unit.

3. Minimum Pilotage: The minimum base pilotage charge is \$1,500.00.

4. Additional Fees:

a) Shifting Vessel. Rates for a vessel shifting shall be:

Zone A (under 3 miles)	50% of base rate
Zone B (3 to 7 miles)	75% of base rate
Zone C (over 7 miles)	100% of base rate

b) Pilot Docking or Undocking. Fees for Pilot Docking or Undocking shall be:

Vessel GT	Fee
Up to 22,000 GT	\$150
Over 22,000 GT to 40,000 GT	\$250
Over 40,000 GT	\$400

- Docking fee is doubled when docking alongside vessel/barge.
- c) Dead Ship. Vessels without power and/or steering are double the regular base rate or shifting rate.
 - d) Dry Docking. Base rate will double and will be assessed when pilot conns vessel into or out of a dry dock or graving dock.
 - e) Anchoring or Heaving Anchor. \$450.00
 - f) Cancellation. \$500.00 if cancelled within up to 2 hours from order time; \$1,500.00 if cancelled less than 2 hours from pilot ordered arrival or sailing time.
 - g) Detention or Holding not caused by weather, competing vessel traffic, or force majeure.
 - i. Detention Charge. \$250.00 to commence for delays when vessel is not ready to be moved 30 minutes after pilot ordered time for both inbound and outbound transits and prorated at 15-minute increments after the initial 30-minute delay charge commences. No charges will be assessed for weather delays or competing vessel traffic.
 - ii. Holding Charge. \$250.00 minimum per first 30 minutes and prorated at 15-minute increments after first 30 minutes. Includes slowing a vessel transit for any reason, including but not limited to holding a vessel at dock, standing by at anchor, reconfiguring tow, transit delays requested by master or agent, delays in/out of shipyards, stevedoring delays while at berth, transit time more than 5.5 hours not affected by weather or competing vessel traffic, and line handling delays. Holding charge for delays of timely discharging a pilot to commence 40 minutes after first line until a pilot can safely disembark and is prorated in 6-minute increments. Charges are per pilot assigned, and no duplicate charges will be assessed.
 - h) Training/Technology Fee. \$15.00 per movement.
 - i) Transportation Fee. \$50.00 per vessel movement.
 - j) Pilot Boat Fund Fee. \$100.00 per inbound or outbound transit.
 - k) Port Communication Fee. \$15.00 per regular inbound or outbound transit. \$100.00 per inbound or outbound transit that restricts traffic flow due to USCG regulations/COTP orders, or vessel dimensions.
 - l) Pilot Station Capitol Fund Fee. \$215.00 for each inbound and outbound transit (shifting excluded). Collection of the fee is to commence after the TBPA notifies the PRRC that construction permits for the site and the pilot station have been obtained. The fee shall be collected for a period of ten years or until construction and related-costs have been paid for, whichever occurs first.

- m) Second Pilot. A second pilot may be assigned to any vessel, dead ship tow, abnormal transit, or when there are special weather circumstances. When a second pilot is required, that vessel will be charged two pilotage fees.
 - n) Pilot Carried to Sea. \$1,000.00 per day plus first-class return transport.
 - o) Late Payment. 3% of total pilotage fee per month 30 days after invoicing.
5. All rates and fees, excluding the Pilot Station Capitol Fund Fee, shall increase by 6% on the anniversary date following the effective date of the Final Order, that is one year after the Final Order is issued, and be collected for three years, then 3% per year for a period of seven years starting four years after the effective date of the Final Order.
6. Discount:
- Year 1. A vessel's charge including all fees, except the Pilot Station Capital Fund Fee and Minimum Pilotage Charge, will be multiplied by 0.8.
 - Year 2. A vessel's charge including all fees, except the Pilot Station Capital Fund Fee and Minimum Pilotage Charge, will be multiplied by 0.9.
- NOTICE OF HEARING RIGHTS**
- This Order will become final agency action if no request for a hearing is received by the Pilotage Rate Review Committee (PRRC) by any person whose substantial interests will be affected by this action within twenty-one days after receipt or publication of this notice in the Florida Administrative Register or in the newspaper, or by close of business on September 6, 2023, whichever is latest. A person whose substantial interests will be affected may petition the PRRC for a hearing involving disputed issues of material fact before an administrative law judge pursuant to Section 120.57(1), Florida Statutes, by filing an appropriate petition with the Executive Director, Pilotage Rate review Committee, Department of Business and Professional Regulation, 2601 Blair Stone Rd., Tallahassee, Florida 32399.
- A petition for a hearing involving disputed issues of material fact must contain information required by Rule 28-106.201, Florida Administrative Code, including a statement of all disputed issues of material fact. The PRRC may refer a petition to the Division of Administrative Hearings for assignment of an administrative law judge only if the petition is in substantial compliance with the rule requirements.
- In the absence of such a petition or if the PRRC concludes that the petitioner has not raised a disputed issue of material fact and does not designate the petition for hearing, this Order shall become final agency action for purposes of Section 120.68, Florida Statutes.
- In accordance with Section 120.573, Florida Statutes, mediation is not available.
