DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION

Granger Drive over Steinhatchee River Bridge Replacement A Project Development and Environment (PD&E) study was completed by the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) on June 9, 2023, for the Granger Drive Bridge Replacement project located in Steinhatchee, Taylor County, Florida. At the request of the Taylor County Board of Commissioners, the build and no-build alternatives for the Granger Drive Bridge, derived from the PD&E Study, were presented for further consideration. At the Taylor County commission meeting held on Monday, October 2, 2023, a motion was made to completely remove the Granger Drive bridge and rescind the Local Agency Program (LAP) agreement with FDOT. This motion was favored 5-0 by the commissioners; therefore, there will be no further work conducted by FDOT on this project.

The 2023-2024 Contract Year claims paying estimate of \$17 billion includes the use of \$4.2 billion of projected year-end fund balance, \$3.5 billion of 2020A pre-event bond proceeds and \$9.3 billion of borrowing capacity comprised of \$7.8 billion of 0-12 month borrowing capacity and \$1.5 billion of 12-24 month borrowing capacity. The borrowing capacity estimate is dependent on many factors, such as the credit rating of the debt, the amount of emergency assessments available for funding the debt, the limitations, or constraints of the financial markets to absorb potential debt issuances, the time necessary to access such markets, and the existing level of interest rates at the time of issuance.
