In addition to the requirements set forth in Rule 59C-1.008, F.A.C., the following requirements apply to the transfer of a Certificate of Need. As provided in Sections 408.037(2) and 408.034(2), F.S., an applicant for a Certificate of Need must certify that it will license and operate the health care facility or service authorized by the Certificate of Need; and the Agency will not issue a license to any health care facility, part of a health care facility, Hospice, or health care service described in Section 408.036(1) or (2), F.S., which fails to receive a required Certificate of Need. This subsection applies to circumstances where the certificate holder will not be the initial licensee or operator of the authorized project. Such circumstances include, for example, a change in the ownership or licensed operator of the certificate holder. Except as provided in this subsection, such changed circumstances require a Certificate of Need that transfers the authorized project to the intended initial licensee or operator.

When the Board finds that an applicant or licensee whom it regulates pursuant to Chapter 460, F.S., has violated the below-listed provisions, it shall issue a final order imposing appropriate penalties, for each count, as set forth in Section 456.072(2), F.S., within the ranges recommended in the following disciplinary guidelines. The identification of offenses are descriptive only; the full language of each statutory provision cited must be considered in order to determine the conduct included. PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission is considering classifying Carolina hammerhead as a prohibited species in state waters. Carolina hammerhead is a recently discovered species of large coastal hammerhead that is visually indistinguishable from scalloped hammerhead. All other species of large coastal hammerhead, including scalloped hammerhead, were added to the Prohibited Species List in 2012 due to their vulnerability to fishing pressure and the presence of nursery grounds in state waters. The purpose of these rule changes is to add Carolina hammerhead to Florida's list of prohibited shark species in response to the discovery and description of the species. The effect of the rule amendment is to prohibit the harvest, possession, or harm of Carolina hammerhead or any part thereof in Florida state waters.

SUMMARY: This rule amendment would add Carolina hammerhead to Florida's Prohibited Species List, which would prohibit the harvest, possession, or harm of Carolina hammerhead or any part thereof in Florida state waters.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Office of Insurance Regulation has declined to rule on the petition for declaratory statement filed by Clinical Specialty Infusions of Dallas, LLC (“Petitioner”) on August 11, 2025. The following is a summary of the agency's declination of the petition:

The petition sought the Office's opinion as to the applicability of section 626.8825(2)(g), Florida Statutes (2025), to Petitioner's specialty pharmacy. Specifically, Petitioner asked whether section 626.8825(2)(g) allows a pharmacy benefit manager (“PBM”) to exclude any pharmacy that meets and complies with applicable FDA rules and regulations from a pharmacy benefits program or specialty network. The OFFICE denied the petition. The OFFICE has issued a Denial of Petition for Declaratory Statement and finds that Petitioner lacks standing because it is not a “substantially affected person” as required by section 120.565(1), Florida Statutes, and it requests a declaratory statement concerning the conduct of another person, in violation of Rule 28-105.001, Florida Administrative Code.
