



SCHOOL READINESS PROGRAM Health and Safety Checklist

School Readiness Program providers must comply with the health and safety standards set by the Department of Children and Families (DCF) in Rules 65C-20.008, 65C-20.012, 65C-22.001, 65C-22.007, 65C-22.008, and 65C-22.010, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.), and the Department of Education, Division of Early Learning (DEL) in Rule 6M-4.620, F.A.C. The standards in this form are additional requirements specific to the School Readiness Program that will be monitored along with the DCF standards. Each standard in this form is labeled to identify the School Readiness Program provider type (i.e., child care facility, school-age program, family day care home, large family child care home, or informal provider).

2	3.3 The provider failed to notify their early learning coalition and inspection authority of an incident or unusual occurrence that was threatening to the health, safety, or welfare of the children or child care personnel. DEL SR Handbook, Section 2.4.B.1		
2	3.4 The provider did not have a dedicated operable telephone accessible and available during hours of operation. DEL SR Handbook , Section 2.4.B.2		

4.Accidents/Incident (Facility/School-Age Program/Homes/Informal Provider) 2 4.1 The provider failed to report a serious injury or death to the early learning coalition and inspection authority. DEL SR Handbook, Section 2.5.A

5. Supervision (Facility/School-Age Program/Homes/Informal Provider) 2 5.1 Child care personnel who had not completed all preservice training requirements were allowed unsupervised contact or care of children. DEL SR Handbook, Section 3.1
