In order to support the statewide process of implementing compatible local- and state-level automated information systems, the Florida Department of Education has developed the following documents:

This document contains the required data elements, functions and timelines which each automated information system component must incorporate within its automated student information system. A. AUTOMATED STUDENT INFORMATION SYSTEM REQUIREMENTS

AUTOMATED STUDENT INFORMATION SYSTEM REQUIREMENTS

Section 1008. 385(2), F.S., requires the development and i mplementation of a comprehensive management information system linking all levels of the state education system. Each school district and the Florida Department of Education shall implement an automated information system component containing student information which is compatible with the statewide comprehensive management information system.

The automated student information system functions and timelines implemented by the Florida Department of Education and each school district are as follows:

HISTORY

1. An automated student information system is to be implemented in each school district by June 30, 1987.

Each school district s hall i nstall an aut omated s tudent i nformation s ystem w hich includes t he dat a elements pr escribed i n S ection B of t his doc ument and w hich contains the procedures for performing the aut omated s tate r eporting and r ecords transfer functions defined in subsections 4. and 5. Each system shall provide all district schools with the local automated functions of basic student information recordkeeping, course s cheduling, at tendance, t est r ecordkeeping and ac ademic g rade and credit reporting (report cards, permanent records and postsecondary transcripts). Automated report cards for elementary schools will be optional for each district.

2. State-level automated student information data base design is to be implemented in the Florida Department of Education by July 1, 1987.

A state-level student data base of information shall be installed for access by state and local education managers and the Legislature. The data base design shall integrate existing Department reports previously collected separately from school districts within the automated reporting formats defined in subsection 5., thereby reducing data burden, improving compatibility among data elements, and providing amore comprehensive and flexible data base of information. The Florida Department of Education shall implement strict controls for privacy and security of student records as contained in Section C of this document.

3. Automated s tate r eporting f unctions are to be implemented by each school district beginning July 1, 1987.

Current state reporting functions are defined in subsection 5.

4. Automated state records transfer of postsecondary transcripts, permanent records and selected Category B information is to be implemented by each school district using the procedures described in the Florida A utomated System for Transferring E ducational Records (F.A.S.T.E.R.) doc ument provided by the Florida Department of E ducation. See http://www.fldoe.org/faster/.

The Florida Automated System for Transferring Records (F.A.S.T.E.R.) is an electronic mail s ystem c ustomized t o m eet t he s tudent transfer need s of t he F lorida s chool districts, colleges and universities. The F.A.S.T.E.R. system is us ed t o r equest t he transfer of student records from districts or postsecondary institutions and to respond to such requests. The sending district or postsecondary institution will transmit s tudent records through the Florida Information Resources Network (FIRN), which will be stored at Northwest Regional D ata C enter and t hen f orwarded t o t he r equesting di strict, postsecondary institution, the Florida Department of Education or other approved entity.

Each s chool district s hall i mplement el ectronic t ransfer of r ecords with other school districts and public postsecondary institutions as listed below. The timelines may differ among districts depending on t he district's F.A.S.T.E.R. Implementation Plan, but will be no I ater than June 30, 1993, for students in grades PK-12, Adult Basic and A dult Secondary Education.

December 1, 1991

All s chool di stricts m ust el ectronically t ransfer s tudent r ecords using state-defined record formats containing permanent record and appropriate Category B information for students i n g rades 9 t hrough 12 t o F lorida publ ic pos tsecondary i nstitutions and between Florida public school districts.

April 1, 1992

All s chool d istricts m ust el ectronically t ransfer s tudent r ecords using state-defined record formats containing per manent r ecord and s elected Category B information for students in grades 6 through 8 who transfer between Florida public school districts.

December 1, 1992

All school di stricts m ust el ectronically t ransfer s tudent r ecords using state-defined record formats containing per manent r ecord and s elected Category B information for students in grades PK through 5 who transfer between Florida public school districts.

All school di stricts m ust el ectronically t ransfer s tudent r ecords using state-defined record formats for transcripts when adult s tudents t ransfer bet ween F lorida publ ic school districts or apply for admission to public postsecondary institutions.

B. AUTOMATED STUDENT INFORMATION SYSTEM DATA ELEMENTS

INTRODUCTION

All aut omated s tudent dat a el ements i ncluded i n t his v olume m ust be incorporated within each school district's automated student information s ystem. Districts m ay add additional data elements within their local automated system to meet local needs.

DEFINITION

There is a working definition associated with each data element, along with applicable examples, codes, notes and exceptions.

LENGTH AND DATA TYPE

Length and data type define the technical field characteristics to be maintained in the automated system for each element.

GRADES AND PROGRAMS REQUIRING THIS DATA ELEMENT

The data elements contained in this volume do not apply uniformly to all grade levels or instructional pr ograms w ithin t he s chool di stricts. A ccordingly, each data element description lists the specific grade levels and programs which are applicable to the data element. For example, "Dual Enrollment Indicator" pertains only to grades 9 through 12.

COMPATIBILITY REQUIREMENT

- All elements must use the specified length, data type and coding definitions provided whenever:
 - 1) automated state reporting is performed;
 - 2) a permanent record is built for internal district use;
 - 3) interdistrict transfer of automated permanent records occurs; or
 - 4) automated transcripts are sent to postsecondary institutions.

The degree of required compatibility between state and I ocal elements varies. Many elements listed in this document need merely be **compatible**, while others must meet stricter **state standards**.

Compatible elements

For data elements which are designated 'No', for State Standard the coding structures used by the districts, the data element names presented in user documentation, and the length and format of the data fields may be the same as that contained in this volume or they may be completely locally defined depending on the district's student information needs. If local definitions are used, it must be possible to convert the information into the state-required codes, descriptors and formats by calculation, computer procedures or subroutines whenever state formats are required.

District documentation of locally defined elements must reference the state data elements for which they are surrogates.

Even though the state does not require the use of the state-defined codes for these compatible elements, districts are encouraged to keep each of these elements in state format whenever possible to minimize the need for and cost of conversion.

State Standard elements

For data elements which are designated 'Yes' for **State Standard**, the coding structures used by the district, the data element names presented in user documentation, the length and format of the data fields for all external occurrences of information in reports, user documentation and display and entry screens must be the same as those contained in this volume.

Thus, **State Standard** elements must meet these additional requirements:

- 1) the state codes **must be u sed I ocally exactly as d efined** in this document for automated student data elements;
- 2) user documentation must list the **State Standard** data element name;
- 3) input and output documents and reports must use the state-defined codes; and
- 4) local screen displays must use the state-defined codes.

These requirements do not address the **physical storage** of the data on tape, disk or other medium, but only how the data elements are to be presented to users in the paper format or on s creen di splays. The s tricter definition of **State S tandard** still a llows the di strict the flexibility to use its own district-defined codes for **physically** storing elements in the student record s ystem while, at the same time, using **State S tandard** codes for di splay, i nput, reports, and user documentation. For example, a date might be required to appear always to the user as MMDDYYYY or MM/DD/YYYY but could be physically stored as YYDDD with nonusers system documentation recording this fact.

These standards do not require the district to show or print the Student Number Identifier, Florida on screens or reports. A local identification number may be displayed or printed as long as the local identification number can be crosswalked to the Student Number Identifier, Florida for state reporting purposes.

In many of the data element definitions included in this volume, a code has been defined for "not applicable." In cases of very specialized data elements, such as "Disciplinary/Referral Action C ode" or "Exceptionality, P rimary," it would seem more sensible in terms of the design of the student records system to record information for such specialized elements only for students to whom the element is per tinent. For both Compatible and State Standard data elements, the codes defined as "not applicable" need not be maintained in the Local datar ecords or displayed on Local screens. At the time of reporting, if it is determined that a particular characteristic or condition is "not applicable" for an individual student, the value meaning "not applicable" may be programmatically inserted into the reporting structure at that time.

This interpretation should allow segmentation of records: for example, discipline records should be maintained only for those students who have been disciplined by school officials. The data element, "Adult Fee Status", should be maintained only for adult students. This should help reduce the need to store large numbers of characters of "noninformation" in the local data records and thus reduce the need for disk or other data storage space.

Use Types

Use Types define the major purposes for which information is collected, maintained and utilized as follows:

State reporting means the data element is required for a state report and must be forwarded to the Florida Department of Education as per the format descriptions.

Local a ccountability identifies t hose dat a el ements w hich t he s chool district must maintain as an audi t t rail i n s upport of s tatutorily r equired ac tivities. T hese i nclude **permanent record** data elements as required by Rule 6A-1.0955, FAC and defined as Category A items which school districts must maintain on a per manent basis for each student.

FASTER indicates the data element is included in one or both of the following:

Postsecondary t ranscript - sent by s chool di stricts to s tate colleges or uni versities upon request of the student..

District records transfer - forwarding to a requesting school district a prescribed set of data elements pertaining to a student to facilitate an initial and prompt placement of the student i n t he r eceiving district's pr ograms. D istrict r ecords t ransfer i ncludes al I permanent record elements plus C ategory B information deem ed to be es sential for initial placement of the student.

Migrant Tracking refers to the Migrant Student Information Exchange (MSIX). Section 1308(b) of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act as amended by the NCLB Act of 2001 requires methods for electronically exchanging student records among districts and states for migrant students. MSIX data is used to facilitate the timely enrollment, grade and course placement and credit accrual of migrant students who move from one district or state to another due to their migrant lifestyle.



FACTS.org is Florida's official online student advising system. High school students can use the services provided on this website to help plan and track educational progress in Florida. Students record their chosen major area of interest on this web site.

STATE REPORTING FORMATS REQUIRING THIS DATA ELEMENT

A section is included with this document which specifies the state reporting formats which school districts must utilize in performing automated state reporting functions. Each data element page lists the specific automated state reporting formats which require the data element.

DATA ELEMENT NUMBER:

The data element number is an internal number as signed by the Education Information Services section, to facilitate use of the data base elements. School districts need not maintain this number in their local automated system.

SURVEY PERIODS REQUIRED



See data element "Survey Period Code" for an ex planation of these codes. The Survey Periods that pertain are listed for each data element. If the Survey Period has 'Yes' next to it, the data element is fully reported in the survey period indicated. If the Survey Period has 'Default' next to it, the data element must contain the default value when submitted to the Department for the survey period. If the Survey Period has 'Varies' next to it, the data element must be fully reported on at least one format for the survey period and a default value must be reported on at least one additional format for the survey period, as indicated in the notes on the format layouts. If the Survey Period has 'Optional' beside it, the district has the option of sending actual data or the default value for the element for the survey period. For survey periods with "Optional" indicated, the data or default value will be ignored by the Department's system and default values will be loaded to the data base for these elements.

YEAR

 \rightarrow

The Year indicates the fiscal year for which this version of the data element is applicable. The Year is updated each July 1 for the next fiscal year until the element is no longer active. Only active data elements are included in each year's listing of data elements on the web site.

The Year Implemented indicates that a data element was first required at the beginning of the indicated fiscal year (July 1).

APPENDIXES

Each appendix that applies to the data element is listed. Appendixes provide one or more of the following: the universe of codes that are valid for the element, expanded explanation of the codes that are valid for the data element, background information about the data element and coding structure, additional information relevant to understanding and reporting the element.

DESCRIPTION OF CHANGES

Beginning with 2011-12, each change to the element is listed with the date the change was made, the part of the element that was changed (e.g., definition, codes, required formats, required surveys, etc.) and a detailed description of the change.

A six-byte numeric field representing the cumulative count of clock hours credited the student in the current career and technical education program number, excluding clock hours reported on the Career and Technical Education Student Course Schedule. These hours include those credited due to work completed prior to enrollment in the reporting institution (transfer, life experience, etc). Additional Hours Credited are not reported for Continuing Workforce Education, Adult General Education, or Apprenticeship.

A student may be assigned only one final adult educational functioning level for each course on each reporting record. Based upon the instruction being reported on the record, select the most appropriate response from those listed under either Adult General Education (Adult Basic Education and Adult Secondary Education), Literacy for Adult ESOL Learners, Adult ESOL, or Adult VESOL.

For the final Adult General Education functioning level, use the following codes to relate functioning levels to grade levels. See Appendix M for grade levels crosswalked by year. If you use a "Comprehensive" course, enter the code for the lowest "score" and track that through the end of the reporting period.

APPENDIX P DEFINITIONS FOR INCIDENT REPORTING

<u>CODE</u> <u>DEFINITION</u>

ALC*

<u>ALCOHOL</u> (possession, use or sale) - Possession, sale, purchase, or use of alcoholic beverages. Use means the person is caught in the act of using, admits to use or is discovered to have used in the course of an investigation.

Examples: Student testing positive for alcohol by law enforcement. Student possessing, using, or selling alcohol.

Non-Examples: Student being suspected of using alcohol without evidence. Student smelled of alcohol who after investigation was found to be diabetic.

Law enforcement should be called if someone in authority observes a student, who appears to be intoxicated, getting out of a car after he/she was just seen driving it, or getting into the driver's seat.

ARS*



ARSON (intentionally setting a fire on school property) - To damage or cause to be damaged, by fire or explosion, any dwelling, structure, or conveyance, whether occupied or not, or its contents.



Examples: Student or other deliberately burning school property (building, fixtures, etc).

Non-Examples: Student or other unintentionally starting a fire.

Note: Report only intentionally-set fires to SESIR.

BAT* <u>BATTERY</u> (physical attack/harm) - The physical use of force or violence by an individual against another.

Examples: Student hitting another with a heavy implement over the head. Student jabbing a pen into another's arm. Student or other engaging in a mutual physical altercation with another and continuing to hit/beat that person even after that person stops fighting, or is no longer able to fight back.

Non-Examples: Student or other delivering a single poke to the chest. Student or other delivers a single, non-injuring strike to the arm of another. Student or other actively engaging in a fight with each other (refer to *Fighting* code as a possible SESIR code). Student or other striking back when hit by an aggressor and becoming engaged in a fight with the aggressor. (Refer to *Fighting* code as a possible SESIR code.)

To distinguish from *Fighting*, report an incident as *Battery* only when the force or violence is carried out against a person who is not fighting back.

<u>CODE</u> <u>DEFINITION</u>

BRK*

BREAKING AND ENTERING/BURGLARY (illegal entry into a facility) - The unlawful entry with force, or unauthorized presence in a building or other structure or conveyance with evidence of the intent to damage or remove property or harm a person(s).

Examples: Student or other breaking and entering into: a school building during athletic events, a school bus, or a residential garage that is being used for a school-sponsored event. Student or other willfully remaining within a building after it has been secured and committing a crime, such as vandalism or theft.

Non-Examples: Student or other entering an unlocked gym, without permission, and using the basketball court. Student or other wandering the halls, after hours, after entering through an unlocked door.

If entry was by force, resulting in facility damage, the incident should be coded as *Breaking and Entering/Burglary*.

BUL**

BULLYING The incident is bullying if the incident includes systematically and chronically inflicting physical hurt or psychological distress on one or more students or employees that is severe or pervasive enough to create an intimidating, hostile, or offensive environment; or unreasonably interfere with the individual's school performance or participation.

Examples: Student uses a picture phone to take a picture of a student using the bathroom at school and places it on the Internet. Student spreads nasty rumors at school about another person, in conversation, in a note, or through e-mail or instant messaging. Student repeatedly teases another person in a mean way, calling him/her inappropriate names, making fun of his/her appearance, or the way he/she talks, dresses, or acts.

Non-Examples: Student calls another student an inappropriate name once.

If the bullying results in any other SESIR incidents do not code the incident as *Bullying*. Instead, the incident should be coded appropriately with the related element coded as bullying-related.

APPENDIX P DEFINITIONS FOR INCIDENT REPORTING

<u>CODE</u> <u>DEFINITION</u>

DOC*

DISRUPTION ON CAMPUS—MAJOR (formerly **DISORDERLY CONDUCT**) (significantly disrupts all or portions of the campus activities, school sponsored events or school bus transportation) - Disruptive behavior that poses a serious threat to the <u>learning environment</u>, health, safety, or welfare of others.

Examples: Student or other making a bomb threat. Student engaging in disruptive behavior that causes the bus driver to stop the bus to ensure the safety of the group. Student or other causing an incident that results in closing the cafeteria. Student or other inciting a riot. Student or other pulling a fire alarm. Student or other deliberately crashing the school computer system. Student or other causing an incident that prevents other students from proceeding to the next class or prevents egress.

Non-Examples: Disruption of a single classroom. Student defying authority. Student disobeying or showing disrespect to others. Student or other using obscene or inappropriate language or gestures. Student not sitting in seat and/or talking loudly while school bus is moving.

Incidents that affect a single classroom during a single class period <u>should not</u> be reported in SESIR. Although schools may consider the non-examples as *Disruption on Campus* for SESIR purposes, they are not. However, schools may want to document these types of incidents on their <u>local</u> student discipline referral form. Bomb threats and false bomb reports, as defined in Sections 790.162 and 790.163 Florida Statutes, are considered felony offenses and require expulsion for at least one year and referral for prosecution. Bomb threats fall under the zero tolerance policy (Section 1006.13(3)(b), Florida Statutes).

DRD*

<u>DRUG SALE/DISTRIBUTION--EXCLUDING ALCOHOL - (illegal sale or distribution of drugs) - The manufacture, cultivation, sale or distribution of any drug, narcotic, controlled substance or substance represented to be a drug.</u>

Examples: Student passing a marijuana cigarette around in the school bathroom. Student giving prescription drugs prescribed for someone else. Student selling cocaine to another. Student or other misrepresenting substances as illegal drugs.

Non-Examples: Students taking medication prescribed for themselves. Student giving an aspirin or other over-the-counter medication to another in dosage prescribed. Student smoking a marijuana cigarette alone. (Refer to *Drug Use/Possession*, *DRU*). Student found with a single marijuana cigarette in backpack. (Refer to *Drug Use/Possession*, *DRU*).



Related Element: Complete the drug description (M, N or O) for all drug sale/distribution incidents. If the incident involves marijuana (M), non controlled substance used as drugs (N) and illicit drugs (O), select the description which represents the most serious offense.

<u>CODE</u> <u>DEFINITION</u>

DRU*

DRUG USE/POSSESSION--EXCLUDING ALCOHOL - (illegal drug possession or use) – The use or possession of any drug, narcotic, or controlled substance or any substance when used for hallucinogenic purposes. Use means the person is caught in the act of using, admits to use or is discovered to have used in the course of an investigation.

Examples: Student or other possessing or being under the influence of illegal drugs at school, at school-sponsored events, or on school transportation. Student possessing or observed swallowing prescription drugs that are not prescribed for him/her. Student(s) found inhaling or ingesting intoxicants, glue, solvents, or aerosols for hallucinogenic purposes.

Non-Examples: Student possessing or using over-the-counter medications in dosage prescribed. Student using inhalers for asthmatic condition. Student possessing drug paraphernalia

Note: Behavioral evidence alone should not be used as a basis for reporting drug use. Although a student giving another an over-the-counter medication may violate school code, it is not reported as a SESIR incident.

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Related Element: Complete the drug description (M, N or O) for all drug use/possession incidents. If the incident involves marijuana (M)), a non-controlled substance used as a drug (N) and other illicit drugs (O), select the description which represents the most serious offense.

FIGHTING (mutual combat, mutual altercation) - When two or more persons mutually participate in use of force or physical violence that requires physical restraint or results in injury.

Examples: Student or other engaging in a fight/combat with another and physical restraint is necessary to stop it. Student becoming engaged in a fight which results in the need for first aid or medical attention for one or both of the participants.

Non-Examples: Student engaging in "horseplay." Student verbally confronting another student/teacher. Student or other engaging in pushing and shoving who is easily separated or stopped. Student or other engaging in a fight which is resolved without injury or need for physical restraint.

Note: Schools may want to document **lower levels of fighting** such as the non-examples listed here on their <u>local</u> student discipline referral form. **SERIOUS incidents** involving mutual participation should be reported as *Fighting*, without regard to who was the original aggressor, unless the guidelines for reporting the incident as a *Battery* apply.

Fighting should be reported to SESIR if at least **one** of the following occurs: (1) Verbal intervention does not stop the fighting and physical restraint is required. For guidance as to who should intervene by using physical restraint, staff should follow local school board policies and procedures. (2) Someone is injured, requiring immediate first aid or subsequent medical attention as a result of the fight.

<u>CODE</u> <u>DEFINITION</u>

HAR**

HARASSMENT - Any threatening, insulting, or dehumanizing gesture, use of data or computer software, or written, verbal, or physical conduct that 1) places a student or school employee in reasonable fear of harm to his or her person or damage to his or her property, 2) has the effect of substantially interfering with a student's educational performance, opportunities, or benefits, or 3) has the effect of substantially disrupting the orderly operation of a school including any course of conduct directed at a specific person that causes substantial emotional distress in such a person and serves no legitimate purpose.

Examples: One student approaches another student and makes an insulting gesture. The targeted student runs off in tears and is visibly upset.

Non Examples: Two students approach each other and one student makes an insulting gesture towards the other student. Both students are good friends; no offense was taken by either student from the interaction.

HOM*

HOMICIDE (murder, manslaughter) - The unjustified killing of one human being by another.

Examples: Student or other person, known or unknown, committing any homicide on school campus, at school-sponsored events, or on school transportation.

Non-Examples: Student or other accidentally dying. Student or other committing suicide.

KID*

<u>KIDNAPPING</u> (abduction of an individual) - Forcibly, or by threat, confining, abducting, or imprisoning another person against his/her will and without lawful authority.

Examples: Student or other holding another person for ransom or reward, as a shield, or as a hostage. Non-custodial caregiver, with a restraining order, picking up a student.

Non-Examples: Student running away with her boyfriend after being picked up from school by him

OMC*

OTHER MAJOR (major incidents that do not fit within the other definitions) - Any serious, harmful incident resulting in the need for law enforcement intervention not previously classified.

Examples: Student produces or knowingly uses counterfeit money. Student participates in gambling activities, i.e., throwing quarters for money. Student possesses pornographic materials depicting others under the age of 18. Student possesses drug paraphernalia.

Non-Examples: Student violating probation. Student or other committing crimes off-campus.

Sometimes arrests are made on school campuses for incidents that occurred <u>off campus</u> or for circumstances that are not school related. These non-examples include arrests for breaking and entering into an off-campus home or building or arrests for violation of probation. **These are not to be reported as SESIR incidents**.

<u>CODE</u> <u>DEFINITION</u>

SXH**

ROB* ROBERY (using force to take something from another) - The taking or attempted taking of anything of value that is owned by another person or organization, under the confrontational circumstances of force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear.

Examples Student or other snatching a gold chain off someone's neck. Student or other extorting lunch money. Student or other engaging in "carjacking."

Non-Examples: Student or other taking money from an unattended purse. (Refer to *Larceny/Theft* code as a possible SESIR code)

STL*LARCENY/THEFT (taking of property from person, building, or a vehicle) - The unauthorized taking, carrying, riding away, or concealing the property of another person, including motor vehicle, without threat, violence, or bodily harm.

Examples: Student or other embezzling public funds. Student or other stealing an item worth \$300 or more. Student finding a checkbook, signing owner's name and making a purchase. Student or other stealing a car or motorcycle.

Non-Examples: Student or other borrowing an item without permission. Student or other committing robbery (code as *Robbery* instead). Student or other stealing an item less than \$300.

Note: The item must be \$300 or more to report in SESIR. However, it is important for schools to document these types of incidents on their <u>local</u> student discipline referral form. The threshold amount for years prior to and including 2004-05 was \$50.

SXB*SEXUAL BATTERY (attempted or actual) - Forced or attempted oral, anal, or vaginal penetration by using a sexual organ or an object simulating a sexual organ, or the anal or vaginal penetration of another by any body part or object.

Examples: Student or other raping someone. Student or other attempting to rape someone.

Non-Examples: Students engaging in consensual sex acts. (Consensual sex is not *Sexual Battery*. Refer to *Sexual Offense* (Other) as a possible SESIR code.)

SEXUAL HARASSMENT (undesired sexual behavior) - Unwanted verbal or physical behavior with sexual connotations by an adult or student that is severe or pervasive enough to create an intimidating, hostile or offensive educational environment, cause discomfort or humiliation or unreasonably interfere with the individual's school performance or participation. [State Board of Education Rule 6A-19.008(1)]. An incident when one person demands a sexual favor from another under the threat of physical harm or adverse consequence.

SXH** SEXUAL HARASSMENT (continued)

Examples: Student or other causing unwanted and ongoing episodes of leering, pinching, grabbing. Student or other making repeated suggestive comments, jokes, or actions of a sexual nature. Student or other pressuring one to engage in sexual activity. Teacher threatening to lower a student's grade if sexual favors are not given. Student or other repeatedly showing a photograph, poster or other visual image of nudity, lewd or sexual activity. Student or other pressuring another student for sexual favors by threatening to prevent him/her from participating in a school activity.

Non-Examples: Students engaging in consensual sex. (Refer to *Sexual Offense* (*Other*) code as a possible SESIR code.) Student unintentionally brushing up against another in the hallway. A single incident of a kiss that may be unwanted.

Note: In some cases, severe incidents of sexual harassment, which include violent physical contact, may be considered a *Battery*, or *Sexual Battery*, if there is physical penetration. Unwanted kissing becomes sufficiently pervasive to report when an individual kisses several others or when an individual kisses another several times.

SXO*SEXUAL OFFENSES (Other) – 1) Other sexual contact, including intercourse, without force or threat of force. 2) Subjecting an individual to lewd sexual gestures, comments, sexual activity, or exposing private body parts in a lewd manner.

Examples: Student or other participating in sexual activity in front of another student. Student or other intentionally exposing genitals. Two students engaging in sexual activity in janitor's closet. Student or other soliciting or encouraging a person to commit a sexual act. Student or other touching the buttocks of another in a lewd, lascivious manner. Student or other making obscene remarks (conduct, which by community standards, is deemed to corrupt public morals by its indecency and/or lewdness).

Non-Examples: Students kissing consensually. Student swearing. A kindergarten child relieving himself publicly. A first grade student hugging another. Student inadvertently touching breasts or buttocks of another.

1. Sexual activity between students should be reported to law enforcement immediately so investigation can be conducted regarding illegal conduct. 2. Consideration should be given to developmentally age-appropriate behaviors in coding sexual offenses for students. Young children and students with exceptionalities may expose themselves without conscious sexual intent. 3. Consult school district student services or psychologist for assessing acting out sexual behaviors that might be indicators of abuse, and use the findings to help determine whether to report the incident as a SESIR incident. Obtain input when the principal is unable to determine if the behavior involving young children is of a sexual nature beyond developmentally appropriate age expectation, when the incident is serious enough to require further investigation, or where students in special education are involved.

TBC**

TOBACCO (cigarettes or other forms of tobacco) - The possession, use, distribution, or sale of tobacco products on school grounds, at school-sponsored events, or on school transportation by any person under the age of 18.

Examples: A student under 18 possessing and/or smoking cigarettes. A student using smokeless tobacco.

Non-Examples: An 18-year-old student smoking a cigar on campus.

Although district codes of student conduct may make it against the <u>district</u> code for students age 18 and older to be smoking on school campus, it still is not in violation of the state statute and should not be reported in SESIR.

Tobacco incidents should be coded as "Reported to Law Enforcement" any time a civil citation is written, whether it is by a law enforcement officer or the "designee." (See Section 569.12, Florida Statutes.)

TRE*

<u>THREAT/INTIMIDATION</u> (instilling fear in others) - A threat to cause physical harm to another person with or without the use of a weapon that includes all of the following elements: (1) intent--an intention that the threat is heard or seen by the person who is the object of the threat; (2) fear--a reasonable fear or apprehension by the person who is the object of the threat that the threat could be carried out; and (3) capability--the ability of the offender to actually carry out the threat directly or by a weapon or other instrument that can easily be obtained.

Examples: Student or other willfully and repeatedly following another or stalking with intent to cause the person to fear for his/her safety. Student or other who willfully and repeatedly uses email or text message to cause another to fear for his/her safety or cause substantial emotional distress (cyber stalking). Student or other making repeated malicious, credible threats in person or by telephone causing the person to fear for his/her safety. Student telling another he/she could kill or knows people who could kill him/her. Student or other violating a restraining order.

Non-Examples: Student or other engaging in mutual combat with another (refer to *Battery* or *Fighting* code as possible SESIR code). Student or other actually using force or violence against another (refer to *Battery* or *Fighting* code as possible SESIR code). Student waving to another student in the hallway, waiting after class to talk to him/her and calling to ask him/her out.

Note: Any threat of violence towards the school, targeted groups, or individuals that <u>does not contain</u> the <u>three elements</u> of <u>intent</u>, <u>fear</u>, and <u>capability</u>, but does result in school disciplinary action <u>and</u> a police investigation, should be coded as *Disruption on Campus* (DOC) if it causes a significant campus disruption.

A person following another without the intent or result of putting the person in fear of death or bodily injury is a less serious behavior than a person who willfully, maliciously and repeatedly follows, harasses and makes a credible threat with intent to place that person in reasonable fear of death or bodily injury (aggravated stalking). (See 784.048(3) Florida Statutes.)

TRS*

TRESPASSING (illegal entry onto campus) - To enter or remain on school grounds/campus, school transportation, or at a school-sponsored event/off campus without authorization or invitation and with no lawful purpose for entry.

Examples: Any unauthorized person entering the campus. Any unauthorized person remaining on property after being directed to leave by the chief administrator or designee.

Non-Examples: Parent entering the building to pick up his/her child without first getting clearance through the office. Person searching for a phone at a school facility after his/her car has broken down.

UBL

UNSUBSTANTIATED BULLYING – After a complete investigation and follow up of a reported bullying incident, the investigator determines that there is not enough evidence to substantiate that the incident meets the criteria of a prohibited act under the definition of bullying as listed in the Jeffery Johnston Stand Up for all Students Act (section 1006.147, F.S.).

UHR

UNSUBSTANTIATED HARASSMENT – After a complete investigation and follow up of a reported harassment incident, the investigator determines that there is not enough evidence to substantiate that the incident meets the criteria of a prohibited act under definition of harassment as listed in the Jeffrey Johnston Stand Up for all Students Act (section 1006.147, F.S.).

VAN*

<u>VANDALISM</u> (destruction, damage, or defacement of school or personal property) - The intentional destruction, damage, or defacement of public or private/personal property without consent of the owner or the person having custody or control of it.

Examples: Student or other defacing with graffiti. Student or other keying or scratching a car. Student or other trashing a room resulting in damages of \$1,000 dollars or more.

Non-Examples: Student or other accidentally damaging chemistry lab equipment. Student or other causing damages under \$1,000.

Note: The amount of damage must be \$1,000 or more to be reported in SESIR, including time and labor. Previous amount of damage threshold through 2004-05 was \$100.

It is important for schools to document lower-level vandalism incidents on their local student discipline referral form.

WPO*

<u>WEAPONS POSSESSION</u> (possession of firearms and other instruments which can cause harm) - Possession of any instrument or object (as defined by Section 790.001(13), Florida Statutes, or district code of conduct) that can inflict serious harm on another person or that can place a person in reasonable fear of serious harm.

WPO* (Continued)

Examples: Student or other possessing a firearm. Student or other using a knife, pocket knife, or other sharp or pointed implement to threaten or harm another.

Non-Examples: Student after investigation found to possess a common pocket knife or eating utensil with no intent to harm. Student possessing items not covered under law or district policy such as pointed instruments, pens, or pencils. Student possessing a cutting tool that is being used in art, shop, or other class.

Offenses in this category fall under the zero tolerance policy (Section 1006.13(3) (b), Florida Statutes). Students found committing this offense are to be expelled for one year (not one school year) and referred for criminal prosecution. Effective January 7, 2003, the Legislature amended Section 1006.07(2)(f), Florida Statutes, to remove reference to a knife, and instead references "a weapon as defined in Chapter 790." In 2006, the Legislature amended the weapons definition in Chapter 790 by adding knife and further exempting plastic utensils and blunt-bladed knives and kept the pocketknife exemption. The definition in Section 790.001(13), Florida Statutes, contains those items required to be in a district's code of student conduct and exempts common pocketknife as well as plastic utensils and blunt-bladed knives. It is the legislative intent that districts enforce policies that allow for discretion in determining whether to punish students found to be in possession of items such as pocketknives, plastic utensils, blunt-bladed knives, etc. Possession of any weapon or knife (including a pocketknife) should be reported to law enforcement for investigation. Pocketknives found to be intended to use to harm another should be reported to SESIR.

Related Element: Complete the weapon description i.e., F-Firearm, Other (incendiary devices, explosives, etc.); H-Handgun; K-Knife; O-Other Weapon (objects can become weapons when used for bodily harm, i.e., scissors, letter openers, air-powered "guns", etc.); R-Rifle or Shotgun, U-Unknown Weapon; and Z (not applicable) for all weapon possession incidents.

NOTES:

For reporting to the U.S.D.O.E., the following incident types are considered to be violent incidents: Battery (BAT), Homicide (HOM), Kidnapping (KID) and Sexual Battery (SXB).

For reporting to the U.S.D.O.E., the following incident types are considered to be violent incidents if they result in bodily injury as reported in the Incident, Injury-Related element: Arson (ARS), Bullying (BUL), Breaking and Entering (BRK), Disruption on Campus – Major (Disorderly Conduct) (DOC), Fighting (FIT), Harassment (HAR), Other Major Unclassified Offenses (OMC), Robbery (ROB), and Sexual Harassment (SXH).

General Rule: If a decision must be made, the incident that caused the most injury or the highest loss of property or monetary cost should be reported.

*Incidents that must be reported to SESIR and ARE EXPECTED to include consultation with law enforcement. An incident should be coded as Yes - Reported to Law Enforcement if an official action was taken by a School Resource Officer (SRO) or local Law Enforcement Officer such as: a case number was assigned, a report was filed, an affidavit was filed, an investigation was conducted and found to be an incident reportable to SESIR OR an arrest was made. The presence of, or consultation with, a law enforcement officer or SRO is not sufficient for an incident to be coded as "Reported to Law Enforcement."

**Incidents that must be reported to SESIR, but MAY NOT NEED to include consultation with law enforcement.



APPENDIX U

TRANSPORTATION MEMBERSHIP CATEGORY

—

MEMBERSHIP CATEGORY signifies one of the student transportation membership categories listed below. **Students may be counted only one time**. Students who ride on more than one bus or mode of transportation during the school day can only be counted once. Students who are transported in the morning or afternoon and who are transported from center to center may only be counted once.

Membership Category A

Individuals With Disabilities Education Act (IDEA)- KG-12, Weighted Kindergarten through twelfth grade students who are classified as disabled. Each student's Individual Educational Plan (IEP) documentation <u>must</u> contain information which specifies that he or she meets one of the following criteria for specialized transportation services:

- 1. Medical equipment required. Medical equipment is defined as wheelchair, crutches, walker, cane, tracheotomy equipment, positioning or unique seating devices.
- 2. Medical condition that requires a special transportation environment as per physician's prescription (for instance, tinted windows, dust-controlled atmosphere, temperature control).
- 3. Aide or monitor required due to disability and specific need of student.
- 4. Shortened day required due to disability and specific need of student.
- 5. School assigned is located in an out-of-district school system.

Membership Category B

Individuals With Disabilities Education Act (IDEA)- KG-12, Unweighted Kindergarten through twelfth grade students who are classified as disabled, who live less than two miles from school, and who do not meet the criteria listed in Category A above. Note that Specific Learning Disabilities (SLD), Speech Impaired (SI), and Language Impaired (LI) students who live less than two miles from school and who are required by the student's Individual Education Plan documentation to receive transportation services are reported here. Note: All of the "two miles or more" unweighted IDEA students will be reported in Membership Category H, "All Other Students Living Two Miles or More, Unweighted". If a student is SLD, SI, or LI and transportation is not required by the IEP documentation, and the student lives less than two miles from school, the student is not eligible for state transportation funding and is reported in Membership Category N, "Non-eligible KG-12 Students Living Less Than Two Miles and all Non-eligible PK Students."

Membership Category C

Individuals With Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) – Prekindergarten, Weighted Prekindergarten students who are disabled pursuant to Rule 6A-6.03026, Florida Administrative Code (FAC)., regardless of distance, and who meet one of the criteria listed in Membership Category A above.

Membership Category E

Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) <u>Prekindergarten</u>, <u>Unweighted</u> Prekindergarten students with disabilities pursuant to Rule 6A-6.03026, FAC., regardless of distance, and who do not meet one of the criteria listed in Membership Category A above.

Membership Category F

Teenage Parents and Infants, Unweighted

Students enrolled in the Teenage Parent Program and their eligible children, pursuant to Section 1003.54, Florida Statutes regardless of distance.

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APPENDIX U (Continued) TRANSPORTATION MEMBERSHIP CATEGORY (Continued)

Membership Category G Hazardous Walking - Elementary, Unweighted

Kindergarten through sixth grade students enrolled in elementary school who meet the criteria for hazardous walking pursuant to Section 1006.23, Florida Statutes. Sixth grade students attending middle or junior high school may not be counted.

All Other Students Living Two Miles or More, Unweighted

Kindergarten through twelfth grade transported students living two miles or more from school if not reported in Membership Categories A and F.

Membership Category I

Membership Category H

Center To Center or Non-center Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), Weighted

Prekindergarten and Kindergarten through twelfth grade students with disabilities who are transported from center to center during the day and who are not counted from home to school in Membership Categories A-H. Included in Membership Category I are students with disabilities who are transported from one destination to another in the state (center to non-center), provided one destination is a school center and the student's Individual Education Plan documentation identifies the need for the instructional programs or service, and specifies that transportation is to be provided by the school district. In order to be claimed in this category, a student must meet one or more of the criteria listed in Membership Category A above.

Membership Category J

Center to Center or Non-center Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), Unweighted

Prekindergarten and Kindergarten through twelfth students with disabilities who are transported from one school center to another, or from one school center to a non-center, if specified in the IEP as described in Membership Category I above, but who do not meet one of the criteria listed in Membership Category A. These students must not have been counted from home to school in Membership Categories A-H.

Membership Category K

Center to Center Vocational and Dual Enrollment Students, Unweighted Prekindergarten and Kindergarten through twelfth grade vocational and dual enrollment students who are transported from center to center during the day and who are not counted from home to school in Membership Categories A-H.

If a student is reported in Membership Categories I. J. or K. the student may not be reported in any other category. A student may only be counted once. The definition of school center is provided in Section 1011.68, Florida Statutes.

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APPENDIX U (Continued) TRANSPORTATION MEMBERSHIP CATEGORY (Continued)

Non-FEFP Fundable Membership Category

Membership Category N

Non-FEFP fundable PK-12 Students Living Less Than Two Miles, all Noneligible PK Students and all non-eligible students living two miles or more from school, such as those funded through other sources.

Transported students living less than two miles from home to school and who are not eligible for funding in the FEFP transportation categorical program. This record may only be entered with Vehicle Category B, school buses. Report all transported students whose homes are less than two miles from school and who do not qualify under one of the other membership categories. Also report all transported Prekindergarten students who are not eligible to be reported in any other Membership Category and all transported students who live two miles or more from school but are funded through other sources.



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APPENDIX P DEFINITIONS FOR INCIDENT REPORTING

<u>CODE</u> <u>DEFINITION</u>

ALC*

<u>ALCOHOL</u> (possession, use or sale) - Possession, sale, purchase, or use of alcoholic beverages. Use means the person is caught in the act of using, admits to use or is discovered to have used in the course of an investigation.

Examples: Student testing positive for alcohol by law enforcement. Student possessing, using, or selling alcohol.

Non-Examples: Student being suspected of using alcohol without evidence. Student smelled of alcohol who after investigation was found to be diabetic.

Law enforcement should be called if someone in authority observes a student, who appears to be intoxicated, getting out of a car after he/she was just seen driving it, or getting into the driver's seat.

ARS*



ARSON (intentionally setting a fire on school property) - To damage or cause to be damaged, by fire or explosion, any dwelling, structure, or conveyance, whether occupied or not, or its contents.



Examples: Student or other deliberately burning school property (building, fixtures, etc).

Non-Examples: Student or other unintentionally starting a fire.

Note: Report only intentionally-set fires to SESIR.

BAT* <u>BATTERY</u> (physical attack/harm) - The physical use of force or violence by an individual against another.

Examples: Student hitting another with a heavy implement over the head. Student jabbing a pen into another's arm. Student or other engaging in a mutual physical altercation with another and continuing to hit/beat that person even after that person stops fighting, or is no longer able to fight back.

Non-Examples: Student or other delivering a single poke to the chest. Student or other delivers a single, non-injuring strike to the arm of another. Student or other actively engaging in a fight with each other (refer to *Fighting* code as a possible SESIR code). Student or other striking back when hit by an aggressor and becoming engaged in a fight with the aggressor. (Refer to *Fighting* code as a possible SESIR code.)

To distinguish from *Fighting*, report an incident as *Battery* only when the force or violence is carried out against a person who is not fighting back.

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APPENDIX P (Continued) DEFINITIONS FOR INCIDENT REPORTING (Continued)

<u>CODE</u> <u>DEFINITION</u>

BRK*

BREAKING AND ENTERING/BURGLARY (illegal entry into a facility) - The unlawful entry with force, or unauthorized presence in a building or other structure or conveyance with evidence of the intent to damage or remove property or harm a person(s).

Examples: Student or other breaking and entering into: a school building during athletic events, a school bus, or a residential garage that is being used for a school-sponsored event. Student or other willfully remaining within a building after it has been secured and committing a crime, such as vandalism or theft.

Non-Examples: Student or other entering an unlocked gym, without permission, and using the basketball court. Student or other wandering the halls, after hours, after entering through an unlocked door.

If entry was by force, resulting in facility damage, the incident should be coded as *Breaking and Entering/Burglary*.

BUL**

BULLYING The incident is bullying if the incident includes systematically and chronically inflicting physical hurt or psychological distress on one or more students or employees that is severe or pervasive enough to create an intimidating, hostile, or offensive environment; or unreasonably interfere with the individual's school performance or participation.

Examples: Student uses a picture phone to take a picture of a student using the bathroom at school and places it on the Internet. Student spreads nasty rumors at school about another person, in conversation, in a note, or through e-mail or instant messaging. Student repeatedly teases another person in a mean way, calling him/her inappropriate names, making fun of his/her appearance, or the way he/she talks, dresses, or acts.

Non-Examples: Student calls another student an inappropriate name once.

If the bullying results in any other SESIR incidents do not code the incident as *Bullying*. Instead, the incident should be coded appropriately with the related element coded as bullying-related.

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APPENDIX P DEFINITIONS FOR INCIDENT REPORTING

<u>CODE</u> <u>DEFINITION</u>

DOC*

DISRUPTION ON CAMPUS—MAJOR (formerly **DISORDERLY CONDUCT**) (significantly disrupts all or portions of the campus activities, school sponsored events or school bus transportation) - Disruptive behavior that poses a serious threat to the <u>learning environment</u>, health, safety, or welfare of others.

Examples: Student or other making a bomb threat. Student engaging in disruptive behavior that causes the bus driver to stop the bus to ensure the safety of the group. Student or other causing an incident that results in closing the cafeteria. Student or other inciting a riot. Student or other pulling a fire alarm. Student or other deliberately crashing the school computer system. Student or other causing an incident that prevents other students from proceeding to the next class or prevents egress.

Non-Examples: Disruption of a single classroom. Student defying authority. Student disobeying or showing disrespect to others. Student or other using obscene or inappropriate language or gestures. Student not sitting in seat and/or talking loudly while school bus is moving.

Incidents that affect a single classroom during a single class period <u>should not</u> be reported in SESIR. Although schools may consider the non-examples as *Disruption on Campus* for SESIR purposes, they are not. However, schools may want to document these types of incidents on their <u>local</u> student discipline referral form. Bomb threats and false bomb reports, as defined in Sections 790.162 and 790.163 Florida Statutes, are considered felony offenses and require expulsion for at least one year and referral for prosecution. Bomb threats fall under the zero tolerance policy (Section 1006.13(3)(b), Florida Statutes).

DRD*

<u>DRUG SALE/DISTRIBUTION--EXCLUDING ALCOHOL - (illegal sale or distribution of drugs) - The manufacture, cultivation, sale or distribution of any drug, narcotic, controlled substance or substance represented to be a drug.</u>

Examples: Student passing a marijuana cigarette around in the school bathroom. Student giving prescription drugs prescribed for someone else. Student selling cocaine to another. Student or other misrepresenting substances as illegal drugs.

Non-Examples: Students taking medication prescribed for themselves. Student giving an aspirin or other over-the-counter medication to another in dosage prescribed. Student smoking a marijuana cigarette alone. (Refer to *Drug Use/Possession*, *DRU*). Student found with a single marijuana cigarette in backpack. (Refer to *Drug Use/Possession*, *DRU*).



Related Element: Complete the drug description (M, N or O) for all drug sale/distribution incidents. If the incident involves marijuana (M), non controlled substance used as drugs (N) and illicit drugs (O), select the description which represents the most serious offense.

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APPENDIX P (Continued) DEFINITIONS FOR INCIDENT REPORTING (Continued)

<u>CODE</u> <u>DEFINITION</u>

DRU*

DRUG USE/POSSESSION--EXCLUDING ALCOHOL - (illegal drug possession or use) – The use or possession of any drug, narcotic, or controlled substance or any substance when used for hallucinogenic purposes. Use means the person is caught in the act of using, admits to use or is discovered to have used in the course of an investigation.

Examples: Student or other possessing or being under the influence of illegal drugs at school, at school-sponsored events, or on school transportation. Student possessing or observed swallowing prescription drugs that are not prescribed for him/her. Student(s) found inhaling or ingesting intoxicants, glue, solvents, or aerosols for hallucinogenic purposes.

Non-Examples: Student possessing or using over-the-counter medications in dosage prescribed. Student using inhalers for asthmatic condition. Student possessing drug paraphernalia

Note: Behavioral evidence alone should not be used as a basis for reporting drug use. Although a student giving another an over-the-counter medication may violate school code, it is not reported as a SESIR incident.

—

Related Element: Complete the drug description (M, N or O) for all drug use/possession incidents. If the incident involves marijuana (M)), a non-controlled substance used as a drug (N) and other illicit drugs (O), select the description which represents the most serious offense.

FIGHTING (mutual combat, mutual altercation) - When two or more persons mutually participate in use of force or physical violence that requires physical restraint or results in injury.

Examples: Student or other engaging in a fight/combat with another and physical restraint is necessary to stop it. Student becoming engaged in a fight which results in the need for first aid or medical attention for one or both of the participants.

Non-Examples: Student engaging in "horseplay." Student verbally confronting another student/teacher. Student or other engaging in pushing and shoving who is easily separated or stopped. Student or other engaging in a fight which is resolved without injury or need for physical restraint.

Note: Schools may want to document **lower levels of fighting** such as the non-examples listed here on their <u>local</u> student discipline referral form. **SERIOUS incidents** involving mutual participation should be reported as *Fighting*, without regard to who was the original aggressor, unless the guidelines for reporting the incident as a *Battery* apply.

Fighting should be reported to SESIR if at least **one** of the following occurs: (1) Verbal intervention does not stop the fighting and physical restraint is required. For guidance as to who should intervene by using physical restraint, staff should follow local school board policies and procedures. (2) Someone is injured, requiring immediate first aid or subsequent medical attention as a result of the fight.

Implementation Date: Fiscal Year 1995-96 July 1, 1995

<u>CODE</u> <u>DEFINITION</u>

HAR**

HARASSMENT - Any threatening, insulting, or dehumanizing gesture, use of data or computer software, or written, verbal, or physical conduct that 1) places a student or school employee in reasonable fear of harm to his or her person or damage to his or her property, 2) has the effect of substantially interfering with a student's educational performance, opportunities, or benefits, or 3) has the effect of substantially disrupting the orderly operation of a school including any course of conduct directed at a specific person that causes substantial emotional distress in such a person and serves no legitimate purpose.

Examples: One student approaches another student and makes an insulting gesture. The targeted student runs off in tears and is visibly upset.

Non Examples: Two students approach each other and one student makes an insulting gesture towards the other student. Both students are good friends; no offense was taken by either student from the interaction.

HOM*

HOMICIDE (murder, manslaughter) - The unjustified killing of one human being by another.

Examples: Student or other person, known or unknown, committing any homicide on school campus, at school-sponsored events, or on school transportation.

Non-Examples: Student or other accidentally dying. Student or other committing suicide.

KID*

<u>KIDNAPPING</u> (abduction of an individual) - Forcibly, or by threat, confining, abducting, or imprisoning another person against his/her will and without lawful authority.

Examples: Student or other holding another person for ransom or reward, as a shield, or as a hostage. Non-custodial caregiver, with a restraining order, picking up a student.

Non-Examples: Student running away with her boyfriend after being picked up from school by him

OMC*

OTHER MAJOR (major incidents that do not fit within the other definitions) - Any serious, harmful incident resulting in the need for law enforcement intervention not previously classified.

Examples: Student produces or knowingly uses counterfeit money. Student participates in gambling activities, i.e., throwing quarters for money. Student possesses pornographic materials depicting others under the age of 18. Student possesses drug paraphernalia.

Non-Examples: Student violating probation. Student or other committing crimes off-campus.

Sometimes arrests are made on school campuses for incidents that occurred <u>off campus</u> or for circumstances that are not school related. These non-examples include arrests for breaking and entering into an off-campus home or building or arrests for violation of probation. **These are not to be reported as SESIR incidents**.

Implementation Date: Fiscal Year 1995-96 July 1, 1995

<u>CODE</u> <u>DEFINITION</u>

SXH**

ROB* ROBERY (using force to take something from another) - The taking or attempted taking of anything of value that is owned by another person or organization, under the confrontational circumstances of force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear.

Examples Student or other snatching a gold chain off someone's neck. Student or other extorting lunch money. Student or other engaging in "carjacking."

Non-Examples: Student or other taking money from an unattended purse. (Refer to *Larceny/Theft* code as a possible SESIR code)

STL*LARCENY/THEFT (taking of property from person, building, or a vehicle) - The unauthorized taking, carrying, riding away, or concealing the property of another person, including motor vehicle, without threat, violence, or bodily harm.

Examples: Student or other embezzling public funds. Student or other stealing an item worth \$300 or more. Student finding a checkbook, signing owner's name and making a purchase. Student or other stealing a car or motorcycle.

Non-Examples: Student or other borrowing an item without permission. Student or other committing robbery (code as *Robbery* instead). Student or other stealing an item less than \$300.

Note: The item must be \$300 or more to report in SESIR. However, it is important for schools to document these types of incidents on their <u>local</u> student discipline referral form. The threshold amount for years prior to and including 2004-05 was \$50.

SXB*SEXUAL BATTERY (attempted or actual) - Forced or attempted oral, anal, or vaginal penetration by using a sexual organ or an object simulating a sexual organ, or the anal or vaginal penetration of another by any body part or object.

Examples: Student or other raping someone. Student or other attempting to rape someone.

Non-Examples: Students engaging in consensual sex acts. (Consensual sex is not *Sexual Battery*. Refer to *Sexual Offense* (Other) as a possible SESIR code.)

SEXUAL HARASSMENT (undesired sexual behavior) - Unwanted verbal or physical behavior with sexual connotations by an adult or student that is severe or pervasive enough to create an intimidating, hostile or offensive educational environment, cause discomfort or humiliation or unreasonably interfere with the individual's school performance or participation. [State Board of Education Rule 6A-19.008(1)]. An incident when one person demands a sexual favor from another under the threat of physical harm or adverse consequence.

<u>CODE</u> <u>DEFINITION</u>

SXH** SEXUAL HARASSMENT (continued)

Examples: Student or other causing unwanted and ongoing episodes of leering, pinching, grabbing. Student or other making repeated suggestive comments, jokes, or actions of a sexual nature. Student or other pressuring one to engage in sexual activity. Teacher threatening to lower a student's grade if sexual favors are not given. Student or other repeatedly showing a photograph, poster or other visual image of nudity, lewd or sexual activity. Student or other pressuring another student for sexual favors by threatening to prevent him/her from participating in a school activity.

Non-Examples: Students engaging in consensual sex. (Refer to *Sexual Offense* (*Other*) code as a possible SESIR code.) Student unintentionally brushing up against another in the hallway. A single incident of a kiss that may be unwanted.

Note: In some cases, severe incidents of sexual harassment, which include violent physical contact, may be considered a *Battery*, or *Sexual Battery*, if there is physical penetration. Unwanted kissing becomes sufficiently pervasive to report when an individual kisses several others or when an individual kisses another several times.

SXO*SEXUAL OFFENSES (Other) – 1) Other sexual contact, including intercourse, without force or threat of force. 2) Subjecting an individual to lewd sexual gestures, comments, sexual activity, or exposing private body parts in a lewd manner.

Examples: Student or other participating in sexual activity in front of another student. Student or other intentionally exposing genitals. Two students engaging in sexual activity in janitor's closet. Student or other soliciting or encouraging a person to commit a sexual act. Student or other touching the buttocks of another in a lewd, lascivious manner. Student or other making obscene remarks (conduct, which by community standards, is deemed to corrupt public morals by its indecency and/or lewdness).

Non-Examples: Students kissing consensually. Student swearing. A kindergarten child relieving himself publicly. A first grade student hugging another. Student inadvertently touching breasts or buttocks of another.

1. Sexual activity between students should be reported to law enforcement immediately so investigation can be conducted regarding illegal conduct. 2. Consideration should be given to developmentally age-appropriate behaviors in coding sexual offenses for students. Young children and students with exceptionalities may expose themselves without conscious sexual intent. 3. Consult school district student services or psychologist for assessing acting out sexual behaviors that might be indicators of abuse, and use the findings to help determine whether to report the incident as a SESIR incident. Obtain input when the principal is unable to determine if the behavior involving young children is of a sexual nature beyond developmentally appropriate age expectation, when the incident is serious enough to require further investigation, or where students in special education are involved.

Implementation Date: Fiscal Year 1995-96 July 1, 1995

CODE

DEFINITION

TBC**

TOBACCO (cigarettes or other forms of tobacco) - The possession, use, distribution, or sale of tobacco products on school grounds, at school-sponsored events, or on school transportation by any person under the age of 18.

Examples: A student under 18 possessing and/or smoking cigarettes. A student using smokeless tobacco.

Non-Examples: An 18-year-old student smoking a cigar on campus.

Although district codes of student conduct may make it against the <u>district</u> code for students age 18 and older to be smoking on school campus, it still is not in violation of the state statute and should not be reported in SESIR.

Tobacco incidents should be coded as "Reported to Law Enforcement" any time a civil citation is written, whether it is by a law enforcement officer or the "designee." (See Section 569.12, Florida Statutes.)

TRE*

<u>THREAT/INTIMIDATION</u> (instilling fear in others) - A threat to cause physical harm to another person with or without the use of a weapon that includes all of the following elements: (1) intent--an intention that the threat is heard or seen by the person who is the object of the threat; (2) fear--a reasonable fear or apprehension by the person who is the object of the threat that the threat could be carried out; and (3) capability--the ability of the offender to actually carry out the threat directly or by a weapon or other instrument that can easily be obtained.

Examples: Student or other willfully and repeatedly following another or stalking with intent to cause the person to fear for his/her safety. Student or other who willfully and repeatedly uses email or text message to cause another to fear for his/her safety or cause substantial emotional distress (cyber stalking). Student or other making repeated malicious, credible threats in person or by telephone causing the person to fear for his/her safety. Student telling another he/she could kill or knows people who could kill him/her. Student or other violating a restraining order.

Non-Examples: Student or other engaging in mutual combat with another (refer to *Battery* or *Fighting* code as possible SESIR code). Student or other actually using force or violence against another (refer to *Battery* or *Fighting* code as possible SESIR code). Student waving to another student in the hallway, waiting after class to talk to him/her and calling to ask him/her out.

Note: Any threat of violence towards the school, targeted groups, or individuals that <u>does not contain</u> the <u>three elements</u> of <u>intent</u>, <u>fear</u>, and <u>capability</u>, but does result in school disciplinary action <u>and</u> a police investigation, should be coded as *Disruption on Campus* (DOC) if it causes a significant campus disruption.

A person following another without the intent or result of putting the person in fear of death or bodily injury is a less serious behavior than a person who willfully, maliciously and repeatedly follows, harasses and makes a credible threat with intent to place that person in reasonable fear of death or bodily injury (aggravated stalking). (See 784.048(3) Florida Statutes.)

Implementation Date: Fiscal Year 1995-96 July 1, 1995

<u>CODE</u> <u>DEFINITION</u>

TRS*

TRESPASSING (illegal entry onto campus) - To enter or remain on school grounds/campus, school transportation, or at a school-sponsored event/off campus without authorization or invitation and with no lawful purpose for entry.

Examples: Any unauthorized person entering the campus. Any unauthorized person remaining on property after being directed to leave by the chief administrator or designee.

Non-Examples: Parent entering the building to pick up his/her child without first getting clearance through the office. Person searching for a phone at a school facility after his/her car has broken down.

UBL

UNSUBSTANTIATED BULLYING – After a complete investigation and follow up of a reported bullying incident, the investigator determines that there is not enough evidence to substantiate that the incident meets the criteria of a prohibited act under the definition of bullying as listed in the Jeffery Johnston Stand Up for all Students Act (section 1006.147, F.S.).

UHR

UNSUBSTANTIATED HARASSMENT – After a complete investigation and follow up of a reported harassment incident, the investigator determines that there is not enough evidence to substantiate that the incident meets the criteria of a prohibited act under definition of harassment as listed in the Jeffrey Johnston Stand Up for all Students Act (section 1006.147, F.S.).

VAN*

<u>VANDALISM</u> (destruction, damage, or defacement of school or personal property) - The intentional destruction, damage, or defacement of public or private/personal property without consent of the owner or the person having custody or control of it.

Examples: Student or other defacing with graffiti. Student or other keying or scratching a car. Student or other trashing a room resulting in damages of \$1,000 dollars or more.

Non-Examples: Student or other accidentally damaging chemistry lab equipment. Student or other causing damages under \$1,000.

Note: The amount of damage must be \$1,000 or more to be reported in SESIR, including time and labor. Previous amount of damage threshold through 2004-05 was \$100.

It is important for schools to document lower-level vandalism incidents on their local student discipline referral form.

WPO*

<u>WEAPONS POSSESSION</u> (possession of firearms and other instruments which can cause harm) - Possession of any instrument or object (as defined by Section 790.001(13), Florida Statutes, or district code of conduct) that can inflict serious harm on another person or that can place a person in reasonable fear of serious harm.

<u>CODE</u> <u>DEFINITION</u>

WPO* (Continued)

Examples: Student or other possessing a firearm. Student or other using a knife, pocket knife, or other sharp or pointed implement to threaten or harm another.

Non-Examples: Student after investigation found to possess a common pocket knife or eating utensil with no intent to harm. Student possessing items not covered under law or district policy such as pointed instruments, pens, or pencils. Student possessing a cutting tool that is being used in art, shop, or other class.

Offenses in this category fall under the zero tolerance policy (Section 1006.13(3) (b), Florida Statutes). Students found committing this offense are to be expelled for one year (not one school year) and referred for criminal prosecution. Effective January 7, 2003, the Legislature amended Section 1006.07(2)(f), Florida Statutes, to remove reference to a knife, and instead references "a weapon as defined in Chapter 790." In 2006, the Legislature amended the weapons definition in Chapter 790 by adding knife and further exempting plastic utensils and blunt-bladed knives and kept the pocketknife exemption. The definition in Section 790.001(13), Florida Statutes, contains those items required to be in a district's code of student conduct and exempts common pocketknife as well as plastic utensils and blunt-bladed knives. It is the legislative intent that districts enforce policies that allow for discretion in determining whether to punish students found to be in possession of items such as pocketknives, plastic utensils, blunt-bladed knives, etc. Possession of any weapon or knife (including a pocketknife) should be reported to law enforcement for investigation. Pocketknives found to be intended to use to harm another should be reported to SESIR.

Related Element: Complete the weapon description i.e., F-Firearm, Other (incendiary devices, explosives, etc.); H-Handgun; K-Knife; O-Other Weapon (objects can become weapons when used for bodily harm, i.e., scissors, letter openers, air-powered "guns", etc.); R-Rifle or Shotgun, U-Unknown Weapon; and Z (not applicable) for all weapon possession incidents.

NOTES:

For reporting to the U.S.D.O.E., the following incident types are considered to be violent incidents: Battery (BAT), Homicide (HOM), Kidnapping (KID) and Sexual Battery (SXB).

For reporting to the U.S.D.O.E., the following incident types are considered to be violent incidents if they result in bodily injury as reported in the Incident, Injury-Related element: Arson (ARS), Bullying (BUL), Breaking and Entering (BRK), Disruption on Campus – Major (Disorderly Conduct) (DOC), Fighting (FIT), Harassment (HAR), Other Major Unclassified Offenses (OMC), Robbery (ROB), and Sexual Harassment (SXH).

General Rule: If a decision must be made, the incident that caused the most injury or the highest loss of property or monetary cost should be reported.

*Incidents that must be reported to SESIR and ARE EXPECTED to include consultation with law enforcement. An incident should be coded as Yes - Reported to Law Enforcement if an official action was taken by a School Resource Officer (SRO) or local Law Enforcement Officer such as: a case number was assigned, a report was filed, an affidavit was filed, an investigation was conducted and found to be an incident reportable to SESIR OR an arrest was made. The presence of, or consultation with, a law enforcement officer or SRO is not sufficient for an incident to be coded as "Reported to Law Enforcement."

**Incidents that must be reported to SESIR, but MAY NOT NEED to include consultation with law enforcement.



TRANSPORTATION MEMBERSHIP CATEGORY

—

MEMBERSHIP CATEGORY signifies one of the student transportation membership categories listed below. **Students may be counted only one time**. Students who ride on more than one bus or mode of transportation during the school day can only be counted once. Students who are transported in the morning or afternoon and who are transported from center to center may only be counted once.

Membership Category A

Individuals With Disabilities Education Act (IDEA)- KG-12, Weighted Kindergarten through twelfth grade students who are classified as disabled. Each student's Individual Educational Plan (IEP) documentation <u>must</u> contain information which specifies that he or she meets one of the following criteria for specialized transportation services:

- 1. Medical equipment required. Medical equipment is defined as wheelchair, crutches, walker, cane, tracheotomy equipment, positioning or unique seating devices.
- 2. Medical condition that requires a special transportation environment as per physician's prescription (for instance, tinted windows, dust-controlled atmosphere, temperature control).
- 3. Aide or monitor required due to disability and specific need of student.
- 4. Shortened day required due to disability and specific need of student.
- 5. School assigned is located in an out-of-district school system.

Membership Category B

Individuals With Disabilities Education Act (IDEA)- KG-12, Unweighted Kindergarten through twelfth grade students who are classified as disabled, who live less than two miles from school, and who do not meet the criteria listed in Category A above. Note that Specific Learning Disabilities (SLD), Speech Impaired (SI), and Language Impaired (LI) students who live less than two miles from school and who are required by the student's Individual Education Plan documentation to receive transportation services are reported here. Note: All of the "two miles or more" unweighted IDEA students will be reported in Membership Category H, "All Other Students Living Two Miles or More, Unweighted". If a student is SLD, SI, or LI and transportation is not required by the IEP documentation, and the student lives less than two miles from school, the student is not eligible for state transportation funding and is reported in Membership Category N, "Non-eligible KG-12 Students Living Less Than Two Miles and all Non-eligible PK Students."

Membership Category C

Individuals With Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) – Prekindergarten, Weighted Prekindergarten students who are disabled pursuant to Rule 6A-6.03026, Florida Administrative Code (FAC)., regardless of distance, and who meet one of the criteria listed in Membership Category A above.

Membership Category E

Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) <u>Prekindergarten</u>, <u>Unweighted</u> Prekindergarten students with disabilities pursuant to Rule 6A-6.03026, FAC., regardless of distance, and who do not meet one of the criteria listed in Membership Category A above.

Membership Category F

Teenage Parents and Infants, Unweighted

Students enrolled in the Teenage Parent Program and their eligible children, pursuant to Section 1003.54, Florida Statutes regardless of distance.

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APPENDIX U (Continued) TRANSPORTATION MEMBERSHIP CATEGORY (Continued)

Membership Category G Hazardous Walking - Elementary, Unweighted

Kindergarten through sixth grade students enrolled in elementary school who meet the criteria for hazardous walking pursuant to Section 1006.23, Florida Statutes. Sixth grade students attending middle or junior high school may not be counted.

All Other Students Living Two Miles or More, Unweighted

Kindergarten through twelfth grade transported students living two miles or more from school if not reported in Membership Categories A and F.

Membership Category I

Membership Category H

Center To Center or Non-center Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), Weighted

Prekindergarten and Kindergarten through twelfth grade students with disabilities who are transported from center to center during the day and who are not counted from home to school in Membership Categories A-H. Included in Membership Category I are students with disabilities who are transported from one destination to another in the state (center to non-center), provided one destination is a school center and the student's Individual Education Plan documentation identifies the need for the instructional programs or service, and specifies that transportation is to be provided by the school district. In order to be claimed in this category, a student must meet one or more of the criteria listed in Membership Category A above.

Membership Category J

Center to Center or Non-center Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), Unweighted

Prekindergarten and Kindergarten through twelfth students with disabilities who are transported from one school center to another, or from one school center to a non-center, if specified in the IEP as described in Membership Category I above, but who do not meet one of the criteria listed in Membership Category A. These students must not have been counted from home to school in Membership Categories A-H.

Membership Category K

Center to Center Vocational and Dual Enrollment Students, Unweighted Prekindergarten and Kindergarten through twelfth grade vocational and dual enrollment students who are transported from center to center during the day and who are not counted from home to school in Membership Categories A-H.

If a student is reported in Membership Categories I. J. or K. the student may not be reported in any other category. A student may only be counted once. The definition of school center is provided in Section 1011.68, Florida Statutes.

Non-FEFP Fundable Membership Category

Membership Category N

Non-FEFP fundable PK-12 Students Living Less Than Two Miles, all Noneligible PK Students and all non-eligible students living two miles or more from school, such as those funded through other sources.

Transported students living less than two miles from home to school and who are not eligible for funding in the FEFP transportation categorical program. This record may only be entered with Vehicle Category B, school buses. Report all transported students whose homes are less than two miles from school and who do not qualify under one of the other membership categories. Also report all transported Prekindergarten students who are not eligible to be reported in any other Membership Category and all transported students who live two miles or more from school but are funded through other sources.

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
